Motions from Council Minutes of April 20, 2015

Motion #C-2015-04-20-03

It was moved by Councillor Hudson, seconded by Councillor Paquette that the sidewalk lease agreement between the Town and Bistro East be approved with the additions of, "subject to an agreeable compost plan", "that the hours of operation be no earlier than 8:00 am and no later than 8:00 pm" and that a clear diagram of the proposed area that demonstrates that there is an allowance of three feet of sidewalk clearance for pedestrian accessibility be submitted and approved. Motion carried

Motion #C-2015-04-20-04

It was moved by Councillor Paquette, seconded by Councillor Hudson that pre-approval be given for PHMC Millett-Campbell to attend the NS Planning Directors Association Conference at a cost not to exceed \$1000.00. Motion carried.

It was moved by Councillor Paquette, seconded by Councillor Hudson that Council pre-approve the expenditure of \$8400 under the Trees/Animals budget line. Motion carried.

Joke of the month:

June is Recreation & Parks month!

Physical activity and recreational pursuits have many benefits. More than just a physical benefit, recreation also provides personal, social, economic and ecological impacts to a community.

The Town of Annapolis and surrounding areas have lots to offer in the way of recreation. There is something for everyone!



NATURAL TICK REPELLENT

As we all know, tick season has arrived. Here are two all natural repellents that you can make at home.

Repellent for Pets

For pets, add 1 cup of water to a spray bottle, followed by 2 cups of distilled white vinegar. Ticks hate the smell and taste of vinegar, and will be easily be repelled by this ingredient alone. Then, add two spoonfuls of vegetable or almond oil, which both contain sulphur (another natural tick repellent). To make a repellent that will also deter fleas, mix in a few spoonfuls of lemon juice, citrus oil, or peppermint oil, which will all repel ticks and fleas while also creating a scented repellent. Spray onto the pet's dry coat, staying away from sensitive areas including eyes, nose, mouth, and genitals. When outdoors for an extended period, spray this solution on two to three times per day. When pets are outdoors generally to use the restroom only, spray the solution onto the animal's coat once per day.

Repellent for Humans

A simple homemade repellent can be made with a few inexpensive household ingredients. In a spray bottle, mix 2 cups of distilled white vinegar and 1 cup of water. To make a scented solution so you do not smell like bitter vinegar all day, add 20 drops of your favourite essential oil or bath oil. Eucalyptus oil is a calm, soothing scent that also works as a tick repellent, while peppermint and citrus oils give off a strong crisp scent that also repel ticks.

After mixing the solution, spray onto clothing, skin, and hair before going outdoors. Reapply every four hours to keep ticks at bay, and examine the skin and hair when returning home to make sure no ticks are on the body.

June 13, 10:00 am Mental Wellness Walk & Talk at the French Basin Trail


