Annapolis Royal Town Council has committed to conducting a Policing Services Review in order to ascertain if the level of policing service provided by the Annapolis Royal Police Department is adequate for its citizens and provides good value for the costs involved in maintaining our own police service, or if we should be considering other options. A committee has been formed which is chaired by Jane DeWolfe, Vice-Chair of the Board of Police Commissioners, other members of the Board, members of Council and George Lahey, Policing Consultant with the Nova Scotia Department of Justice.

The first meeting has taken place and later in the process public input will be sought.

MOTIONS FROM COUNCIL- APRIL 18, 2016

MOTION #C-2016-04-18-03: Fundraising for the Dog Park

It was moved by Councillor Mersereau, seconded by Deputy Mayor Power to approve the Active Living Coordinator's proposal for fundraising to raise funds for the dog park. Motion carried.

MOTION #C-2016-04-18-04: Erection of Signs at the Academy Site

It was moved by Councillor Hudson, seconded by Councillor Mersereau to approve the allowance of signs at the Academy site for the proposed new condo development as per Section 7.5(i) of the Land Use By-Law. Motion carried.

MOTION #C-2016-04-18-05: Planning Permission

It was moved by Councillor Hudson, seconded by Councillor Mersereau that the applicant at 200 St. George Street be given heritage approval to install a projecting wall sign and safety railing as detailed in the application AR16-005-HER, providing the requirements of the Land Use By-Law are met. Motion carried.

MOTION #C-2016-04-18-06: Planning Permission

It was moved by Councillor Mersereau, seconded by Deputy Mayor Power that the applicant at 304 St. George Street be given heritage approval to install a window sign as detailed in the application AR16-006-HER, providing the requirements of the Land Use By-Law are met. Motion carried.

MOTION #C-2016-04-18-07: Planning Permission

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Hudson that the applicant at 467-471 St. George Street be given heritage approval to remove the 1980's addition and replace the wall to original position with same materials as currently used, as detailed in the application AR16-009-HER, providing the requirements of the Land Use By-Law are met. Motion carried.

MOTION #C-2016-04-18-08: Planning Permission

It was moved by Councillor Hudson, seconded by Councillor Mersereau that the applicant at 209 St. George Street be given heritage approval to install a wooden deck and steel door as detailed in the application AR16-008-HER, providing the requirements of the Land Use By-Law are met. Motion carried.

MOTION #C-2016-04-18-09: Exception to MPS/LUB to allow for redevelopment of ARRA

It was moved by Councillor Mersereau, seconded by Deputy Mayor Power to approve the initiation of an MPS/LUB amendment to enable consideration of redevelopment or reuse of the ARRA property. Motion carried.

MOTION #C-2016-04-18-10: Staff Lieu Time Policy

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Hudson to adopt the Lieu Time Policy Draft submitted to the Committee of the Whole meeting on April 7th, 2016 with a provision that the implementation of the 60 hour ceiling become effective July 1, 2016. Motion carried.

MOTION #C-2016-04-18-11: Fall Election Voting Dates

It was moved by Councillor Hudson, seconded by Councillor Mersereau that designated poll dates be October 6th and October 11th from 12p.m.-8p.m. and the Director of Finance will see if coordination is possible for those dates with the County. Motion carried.

MOTION #C-2016-04-18-12: Appointment of Members of the Police Review Committee

It was moved by Councillor Mersereau, seconded by Deputy Mayor Power that Rion Microys and Danny McClair be appointed as additional voting members of the Police Review Committee. Motion carried.

MOTION #C-2016-04-18-13: Hearing Regarding the County Water Rate Application

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Hudson to approve for the Town to notify the NSUARB, by the April 25th deadline that the Town wishes to have formal standing to present evidence or cross-examine witnesses in relation to the Hearing for the County's recent Water Rate Application. Motion carried.

Academy Update

The Sales Launch of the Academy Lifestyle Condominiums kicked into high gear on May 12th. We were pleased to see so many out for the event. A steady stream of people have since visited the Sales Center at the Academy and taken tours of the building. I am pleased to report that five units have been sold and several are pending.



I want to thank Town Staff of Annapolis Royal and volunteers for their help with the event. It has also been a pleasure to ATANNAPOLIS ROYAL collaborate with local web designer Jim Todd and graphic artist Kim Gunn on this project.

I have decided to donate a condo to the Academy Condo Corporation (the operating body which will be formed and controlled by the condo owners). The donated condo will become a designated residence for an onsite caretaker. The caretaker will receive free rent in exchange for cleaning the building, removing snow and cutting grass. This will reduce the condo fees for owners as these services will no longer have to be contracted out.

We will not be using the current oil heating system. Heat pumps, with electric heating as a back up, will be installed in each unit. Each person will be responsible for their own heating costs.

We are extremely excited about this project, and proud to be the first school in Nova Scotia to be doing this. **The launch into space will take place on June 2nd at 10am on the AWEC soccer field.** All are invited to attend.
