Needles and lancets are a safety hazard to the garbage collectors and all who handle waste. For this reason they must be kept out of garbage and recycling bags. Here are two options for disposal of needles.

•Diabetic needles have a special disposal in Nova Scotia. Your local pharmacy will provide you with a free plastic container to save your needles in. When full, drop off the container at your pharmacy.

•Non-diabetic needles (ex. veterinarian needles) can be brought for <u>free</u> to the Valley Waste Management Centre in Kentville or Lawrencetown. They must be in a hard plastic container with a tight fitting lid and labeled "Needles" or "Sharps".

UNAPPROVED MOTIONS FROM THE TOWN COUNCIL MEETING OF MARCH 18, 2013

MOTION #a

It was moved by Councillor Paquette, seconded by Councillor Mersereau that the application to replace doors and windows at 314 St. George Street, be given heritage approval with the condition that the replacement windows be the same size, shape and configuration as existing, and the replacement door facing St. George Street matches the existing except for the window size within the door. **CARRIED**.

MOTION #b

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Hudson to approve Annapolis Region Community Arts Council (ARCAC) Groundworks 2013 project from June 1 to 2, 2013 and ARCAC will be responsible to remove/dismantle parts that will interfere with the trail in a timely matter. **CARRIED. It was moved by Councillor Hudson, seconded by Councillor Paquette that Councillor Mersereau and CAO St-Amour attend the session in Halifax, March 26, 2013, on behalf of Council. **CARRIED**

MOTION #d

It was moved by Councillor Hudson, seconded by Council Paquette, that the quarterly billing for 9199 Highway 8 in Lequille, be stopped as of March 31,2013 due to fire, until a new house or a meter is requested from the land owner. **CARRIED.**

MOTION #e

It was moved by Councillor Paquette, seconded by Councillor Hudson that the Human Resource Policy 3.05 be changed to state the cost of living adjustment will be based on the average Consumer Price Index of Nova Scotia statistics for the preceding year. **CARRIED.**

Tree News

It's April now. This March was so much colder now than in 2012. Nevertheless all our spring bloomers are ready to go the moment it gets warm and the sun has a lot more strength. Do you know the trees that bloom the earliest in the spring?

The star magnolias (magnolia stellata and loebnerii) will be the first to show some white at the court house and the Historic Gardens. There is a self guided magnolia map available at the Historic Gardens. That way you can find all the magnolias in Town and know their name and parentage. A lot of magnolias species have been crossed with one another, the parentage will tell you what their "parents" are....it's a great experience when you look at all the different colours and shapes. Also have your camera ready, magnolias blossoms are very satisfying to photograph or paint.

Our elm and red maple trees are also coming into bloom. They have very similar blossoms. Often they are high up in the tree but will give the crown a red and yellow shine. They are quite beautiful and interesting flowers when you look at them closely. This is also a good way to identify trees and know for sure if you have an elm or a red maple in you yard. Elm tree injections will happen as soon as the first leaves of the elm come out which happens right after they finish blooming. BURNING OF THE BRUSH

The Annapolis Royal Volunteer Fire Department will be burning brush and tree debris in April/May. The purpose of this is to provide the Fire Department with a practice drill.
