Dear Members of the Board of Police Commissioners.

Attached to this letter is a petition regarding speeding and vehicle noise in the Town of Annapolis Royal. The petition was signed by 97 residents of our Town during door to door meetings in the month of October, 2011. You will note that the majority of signatures are from residents of Upper St George St and Champlain Dr. Feedback received during our meetings reinforces our concern about the present traffic situation – it is major issue with our fellow citizens and needs more police attention.

Annapolis Royal is a beautiful place, full of natural beauty and built heritage. Many people visit and move here to enjoy a historic, peaceful atmosphere. Our Town is also a designated National Historic District, an honour that should be a source of pride. Disrespectful drivers, most from the area immediately around our Town, are disrupting the enjoyment of Town residents and visitors and creating an unpleasant and unsafe environment. This unacceptable situation must be changed. Our Town and its residents deserve better.

Petitioners are asking that a more effective strategy be used by our police force to deal with the unprecedented number of speeding vehicles and amount of engine noise on our streets. They are asking that sections of the Motor Vehicle Act pertinent to these problems be strictly enforced and that a clearer message be sent to those driving on our streets that speeding and use of engine brakes is not tolerated in the Town. In our door to door meetings, many residents had good ideas for dealing with these issues and would be open to discussions with our police force so that these problems can be resolved.

We believe that Annapolis Royal currently has the human and financial resources to solve these problems. The police budget for 2011 is 17 percent of the Town's budget, a figure amounting to almost \$300,000. We believe that with this expenditure of taxpayers' dollars it is possible to control and even eliminate these problems, especially given the relatively small footprint of our town.

We, and the many people who have signed this petition, ask that the Board of Police Commissioners push for solutions to the speeding and engine noise issues so that all our streets can be safe and pleasant for everyone. We look forward to hearing from you about decisions made regarding this matter and to increased police action that results in the enforcement of speed and noise limitations.
