#### Town of Annapolis Royal 2014/2015 Operating Budget

On June 16, 2014, Town of Annapolis Royal Council passed the 2014/2015 operating budget without increases in residential or commercial tax rates. Rates remain as:


- Residential \$1.65 for each \$100 of assessed property value
- Commercial \$3.15 for each \$100 of assessed property value

The chart below illustrates where tax dollars are projected to be spent this year shown as a percentage of the total operating budget.

#### Motions from Unapproved Minutes of Regular Council Meeting held June 16, 2014

#### **MOTION a) Compost Bins for Businesses**

Moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Paquette that

a) effective October 9, 2013 for a one year trial period ending October 15, 2014, that a minimum of 2 community compost bins be placed at the public works yard for public use and serviced by the Public Works Department, and

b) effective from April 15 to October 15 each year until the policy is revised, businesses in Town may request an additional Town compost bin at their place of business, to be picked up by the Public Works Department on the alternate week to the Valley Waste pickup at a cost to the business in the amount of \$25.00 per pickup, per bin, to be billed to businesses that sign on for the additional pickup regardless of whether the bin is full and unless the Town receives written notice of suspension of pickup.

#### **MOTION b) New Building Canada Fund**

Moved by Councillor Paquette seconded by Councillor Hudson, that with regards to the New Building Canada Fund the priorities in order are #1, Disaster Mitigation Infrastructure and Drinking Water, #2 Drinking Water with Wastewater and #3 Connectivity and Broadband with Innovation. CARRIED

#### MOTION c) Legion Parking Lot

Moved by Councillor Paquette, seconded by Councillor Hudson that Council invite Legion representatives to a meeting of Council for the purpose of discussing the Legion Parking Lot area. CARRIED

#### MOTION d) Purchase of Convex Mirror

Moved by Councillor Hudson, seconded by Councillor Mersereau that Council approve the purchase of a 36 inch Exterior Convex Mirror in the amount of \$337.35 plus HST to replace the existing mirror on St. George Street. CARRIED

#### MOTION e) Purchase of Brackets

Moved by Councillor Mersereau, seconded by Deputy Mayor Power that Council approve the purchase an additional 3 brackets to be used for the purpose of mounting the portable speed sign. CARRIED

#### MOTION f) Parking

Moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Paquette that Council approve Administration to invite Parks Canada to negotiate for diagonal parking in front of Fort Anne by the cemetery. CARRIED

#### MOTION g) In Memory of Daurene Lewis

Moved by Councillor Hudson, seconded by Councillor Mersereau that Council approve a rose bush or small flower bush like the Snow Day Surprise be purchased and planted as soon as possible near the corner of the stairs and the ramp going into Town Hall and that the plant be dedicated in memory of Daurene Lewis. CARRIED

#### MOTION h) Parks Canada Signage

Moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Paquette that Council give approval to the applicant to replace the current two Parks Canada directional signs on Prince Albert Road, providing all the requirements of the Land Use By-Law are met. CARRIED

#### MOTION i) Request for Changes to a Heritage Property

Moved by Councillor Mersereau, seconded by Deputy Mayor Power that the applicant at 430 St. George Street be given heritage approval to repair and replace the windows to match the size and shape of the existing windows, repair the side verandah, remove the rear porch, rotate and move the garage, and other repairs as detailed in application AR14-014-HER, providing all conditions of the Land Use By-law are met. CARRIED

#### MOTION j) Request for Changes to a Heritage Property

Moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Paquette that the applicant at 396 St. George Street be given heritage approval to add a staircase at the back of the building and install a wooden sign on the front lawn by the garden, as detailed in application AR14-015-HER, providing all conditions of the Land Use By-law are met. CARRIED

#### MOTION k) Request for Changes to a Heritage Property

Moved by Councillor Paquette, seconded by Councillor Hudson that the applicant at 712 St. George Street be given heritage approval to install a fence at the rear of property as detailed in application AR14-017-HER, providing all conditions of the Land Use By-law are met. Mayor Tompkins voted Nay. CARRIED

#### MOTION I) Request for Changes to a Heritage Property

Moved by Councillor Hudson, seconded by Councillor Mersereau that the applicant at 62 Chapel Street be given heritage approval to replace the windows in the porch with double hung wooden windows as detailed in application AR14-018-HER, providing all conditions of the Land Use By-law are met and to stipulate that the windows be of similar size as the existing ones. CARRIED

#### MOTION m) Honorarium

Moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Paquette that a one-time \$500.00 honorarium be given to Caitlin Bridson-Pateman, to assist in the additional expenses that will occur in her new role as Queen Annapolisa 82nd. CARRIED

#### **MOTION n) Tax Rates**

Moved by Councillor Mersereau, seconded by Councillor Paquette, that the operating budget for 2014/15 of \$1,657,690.59 be passed with tax rates of \$1.65 for residential and \$3.15 for commercial. CARRIED

#### **MOTION o) Capital Budget**

Moved by Councillor Mersereau, seconded by Councillor Paquette that the 2014/15 capital budget of \$273,400.00 be approved with an understanding that with the purchase of tablets there will be no paper produced for anything that can be distributed electronically. **CARRIED**
