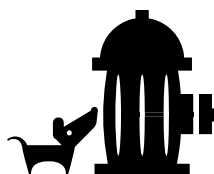

Planning & Heritage Advisory Committee Meeting Dates MOTION #C-2014-MAY-21-04

Moved by Councillor Paquette, seconded by Councillor Hudson that Council approve Planning & Heritage Advisory Committee meetings be held the first Mondays of June, July and September, 2014 at 6:30 pm and for the period of October 2014 to May 2015 the meetings be held the first Mondays of the month at 9:30 am. **CARRIED**

Application AR14-011-HER MOTION #C-2014-MAY-21-05

Sidewalk Lease Agreement MOTION #C-2014-MAY-21-08

Moved by Councillor Paquette, seconded by Councillor Hudson that Council approves the proposed agreement with Amanda Egle carrying on business as Café Compose for the purpose of utilizing a portion of "the sidewalk area" in front of Café Compose at 285 St. George Street for café use, subject to the conditions of the agreement as amended: sub section (a) that the Town of Annapolis Royal shall lease the section measuring 3 feet adjacent to the front of the building by 12 feet, at 285 St. George Street for the Sum of Two Dollars (\$2.00) per square foot for the year 2014/2015. **CARRIED**

August Council Meeting MOTION #C-2014-MAY-21-12

Moved by Councillor Paquette, seconded by Councillor Hudson that one Council meeting be held in August on the 18th at 6 pm, with a time limit of a maximum time of 2 hours, and the agenda will be restricted to specific emergency issues which could include the audited financial statements. **CARRIED**

Valley Waste Resource Management MOTION #C-2014-MAY-21-13

Moved by Councillor Hudson, seconded by Councillor Mersereau that effective October 9th for a one year trial period ending October 15, 2014, that a minimum of 2 community compost bins be placed at the public works yard for public use and serviced by the Public Works Department and, that businesses in Town may request an additional Town compost bin at their place of business, to be picked up by Public Works Department on the alternate week to the Valley Waste pickup at a cost to the business in the amount of \$25.00 per pick up per bin, businesses that sign on for the additional pickup whether the bin is full, 1/2 full or empty will be billed for every additional pickup unless the Town receives advance written notice of suspension of pickup, and this policy will be effective from April 15 to October 15 each year until revised. **CARRIED**



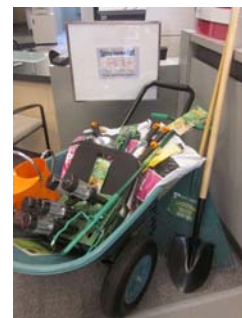

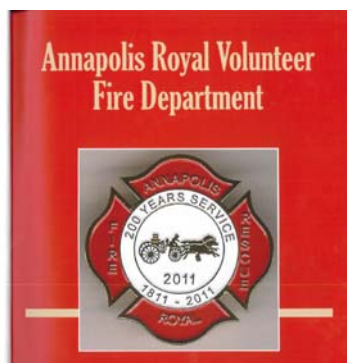

The swings have some serious cracks and rot in the upper support beams, and will be repaired or replaced and then inspected by a certified inspector very shortly. Please feel free to use the rest of the playground, but stay off the swings until further notice. Sorry to any playground users for this inconvenience. After studying the current usage and examining some potential safety concerns, the Town has decided to remove the adult exercise equipment from the playground and eventually relocate it to an "adult only" recreation site in Town which is yet to be determined. In place of this equipment, and throughout the playground, we will be installing some additional seating, family activity areas, community use recreation equipment, and landscaping elements that will encourage families to be active together. The new elements will be designed with respect for the Town's heritage and the existing landscapes scenic beauty.
