Please be Advised – Important Public Notice

Council for the Town of Annapolis Royal is considering recom-



mendations from the Traffic Flow Advisory Committee that will create changes in Annapolis Royal. Prior to voting on the recommendations, Council wants to offer community members the opportunity for input.

The recommendations are summarized as

follows:

- To make one block of St. Anthony Street one-way; the block between Victoria Street and St. George Street. Traffic would flow west bound, travelling in the direction of Fort Anne.
- That a stop sign and a "no right-hand turn" sign be installed at the intersection of St Anthony/St George travelling from the lights down St. George Street, making the intersection a two-way stop.

MOTION #C2016-01-16-03: Aid in Effort to Organise Tutors

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Sanford to provide space as available for the purposes of tutoring and the Town will share on Facebook any posts related and list Beth Fairn as a contact. Motion carried.

MOTION #C2016-01-16-04: Change to Town Policy

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Kinsella that Council agree to change the Policy on Appointments to Boards, Committee and Task Forces Policy to read all memberships shall be approved by Council annually in December, on the recommendation of the Chair, or more often, as required. Motion carried.







PARKS CANADA CORNER

First of all, thanks to everyone who came out to help Parks Canada celebrate Fort Anne's 100th anniversary as a National Historic Site. It was great to see the community come together to celebrate this site, which means a lot to Annapolis Royal, but to all of Canada. We hope to see you at many more special events as we celebrate Canada's 150th and Fort Anne's 100th anniversaries.

Work is proceeding as planned on the new maintenance garage, and on the Garrison Graveyard's cast iron fence. The disassembly of the fence went better than expected and it's now at an indoor facility in Grand Falls, NB where they're making the necessary repairs. Original components are being treated to ensure their preservation prior to the fence being reassembled with any replicates needed. Plans are to reinstall the fence in the spring.

The garage construction is moving along well after encountering poor soil conditions. Backfilling of the foundation is nearly complete and the wooden structure is now being erected.

Stay tuned as we firm up plans for an exhibit at the O'Dell House Museum, opening around Heritage Day - February 20th. We are bringing out some of Fort Anne's historic imagery and maps on exhibit. Thanks to the Annapolis Heritage Society for the collaboration.

We hope you will continue to enjoy the grounds of Fort Anne over the winter, but please note that the perimeter path is not maintained at this time of year. We know that your dogs also love Fort Anne, but please ensure your dog is on leash, which makes it much easier for you to pick up after them.

LIONS NEWS
