It is preferred that the signs are reflective, white with a blue background and are clearly visible from the road by operators of vehicles.

Such signs may be purchased from suppliers such as Annapolis Home Hardware Building Centre, or from Dieter's Graphics and signs.

Posting civic numbers as described above can greatly aid emergency services and is an important safety precaution.

#### MOTION #C2017-FEB-14-03 AIRO Marketing Campaign



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



### LIONS NEWS- March is Eye Donor Awareness Month






# Weekly Self Defense and Grappling Program for high school students and adults
