
2017/2018 Operating and Capital Budgets Approved

At the April 18, 2017 meeting, Town Council approved a \$1.9 million dollar operating budget for the 2017/2018 fiscal year. The tax rates of \$1.65 for residential and \$3.15 for commercial will remain the same. A PDF copy of the approved budget is available on the Town website.

The key highlight of the 2017/2018 operating budget is a comprehensive marketing and economic development budget driven mostly by Canada 150 summer celebrations and Rendez-Vous 2017 (Tall Ships), both of which will be made possible by grants, along with a continuation of the boat building and façade improvement programs.

Council also approved a \$1.5 million dollar capital budget which includes major items such as paving and sidewalk enhancements to lower St. George Street, the water-

front amphitheatre project, sewer improvements to several areas in Town, renovations to the west wing of The Academy, and partnering with the Municipality of the County of Annapolis to bring fibre optic cable to Annapolis Royal. These significant projects are possible in part due to the many grants and donations that have been committed or will be received.



Annapolis Royal Building and Design Awards 2017

The Town of Annapolis Royal is happy to announce that it will be holding Building and Design Awards in 2017. This program is intended to promote the preservation and restoration of heritage buildings and to encourage contemporary construction that is sympathetic to its historical environs.

Message from the Mayor



Excitement is certainly in the air. There is a change in the weather, and Town Hall is looking forward to a tourist season full of celebratory activities and events. Canada Day 2017 marks the 150th Anniversary of Confederation, and we are extremely pleased that the Deputy Mayor and members of the Twinning Committee, from our sister city Royan in France, will be here to celebrate with us. The town will be

decorated to reflect Canada's 150th, and in addition to traditional events and activities, the Town will host music and community events throughout the Canada Day weekend.

In August, the Town of Annapolis Royal will also be host to the farewell sail past of the Tall Ships of Rendevous 2017 - with 1860 costumed re-enactors, the Pirates of Halifax, music on the waterfront, including JP Cormier, and much, much more - topped off with a huge fireworks show to close the evening. Watch for future announcements and advertisement of these, and other, exciting activities and events throughout this celebratory year.

In preparation for an anticipated record number of visitors, buildings around town are being gussied up - courtesy of the Town of Annapolis Royal and Annapolis Investments in Rural Opportunity (AIRO) co-sponsored Annapolis Royal Facade Improvement Program. And a marketing campaign, spearhead by AIRO in partnership with the Town of Annapolis Royal and the County of Annapolis, to attract remote works around the world to move to our area, has now reached millions of people. Excavation of Petit Parc on St. George Street, to make way for the waterfront amphitheatre project - in partnership with Bear River First Nation - started in earnest on April 25th. It will be marked as a place of first contact and Mi'kmaq culture and heritage, and will serve as a renewal and permanent reminder of the historic bond of friendship established in 1605 between Grand Chief Henri Membertou and Pierre Du Gua de Mons.

MOTIONS FROM COUNCIL: April 18, 2017 (From Unapproved Minutes. Approval of minutes will occur at the Council meeting)

MOTION #C2017-APR-18-04 Rededication of Town Hall

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Kinsella to ratify the electronic vote that Council pre-approve the cost for an inscription on the blank side of the Town Hall corner stone, at a cost of \$850 for the Rededication of Town Hall from the 2017/2018 operating budget. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2017-APR-18-05 Amphitheatre Tender

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella, seconded by Councillor Sanford to ratify the electronic vote that Council accept the Brown Bros. Excavating Ltd tender in relation to the construction of the amphitheatre as per the recommendation outlined in the engineer report dated April 11, 2017. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2017-APR-18-06 Police Chief Retirement Luncheon

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power seconded by Councillor Sanford approve that Council host a retirement luncheon for the Police Chief on May 31st, 2017 at the Fort Anne Cafe. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-APR-18-07 Development Agreement- Causeway Project

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella seconded by Deputy Mayor Power that Council proceed with requiring a Development Agreement under our current Municipal Planning Strategy, Land Use By-Law and our interpretation of the Hogg's Island municipal boundary. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-APR-18-08 Development Agreement Fee- Causeway Project

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power seconded by Councillor Sanford that Council waive the \$1000 Development Agreement permit fee. **Motion Carried**

MOTION #C2017-APR-18-09 121 Prince Albert Road Development Agreement

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella seconded by Councillor Sanford that Council approve the application for 121 Prince Albert Road as a non-substantial change to the 2009 Development Agreement, as recommended by our Development Officer. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-APR-18-10 Approval of the General Operating Budget

It was moved by Councillor Sanford, seconded by Deputy Mayor Power that Council approve the General Operating budget totaling \$1.9 million with the residential tax rate at \$1.65 and the commercial tax rate at \$3.15 for the 2017/2018 fiscal year. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-APR-18-11 Approval of the Capital Budget

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power seconded by Councillor Kinsella that Council approve a \$1.5 million Capital budget that provides for all the projects outlined in the draft capital budget presented. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-APR-18-12 Buy Out of the Photocopier

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella seconded by Councillor Sanford that Council approve the buy-out of the existing Sharp MX2610 copier in the amount of \$2,395 plus HST in the 2016/2017 year. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-APR-18-13 Capital Equipment Replacement Policy

It was moved by Councillor Sanford seconded by Deputy Mayor Power that Council approve the Capital Equipment Replacement Policy with the updated appendices A and B. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-APR-18-14 Low Income Tax Exemption Policy

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power seconded by Councillor Kinsella that Council change the existing Low Income Tax Exemption Policy as shown in the revised attached policy. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-APR-18-15 Snow and Ice Control Policy

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella seconded by Councillor Sanford that Council approve the amended Snow and Ice Control policy as presented and that the CAO be authorized to consider the two existing claims by the property owners of 454 St George Street and 108 Victoria Street under this amended policy. **Motion Carried.**


