Rebates to New Home Construction

Efficiency Nova Scotia is pleased to announce that effective May 1, 2017, rebates in the New Home Construction program (NHC) are increasing! The new rebates range from \$2,000 to \$5,000. The targets for the program have not changed. There are two ways to receive these rebates:

- 1. Anyone currently enrolled in NHC that has their on-site assessment performed on or after May 1, 2017 will be eligible for the new rebates
- 2. Any new registrations in NHC made on or after May 1, 2017 will be eligible for the new rebates

MOTION #C2017-MAY-15-03 Noise By-law Exemption Hillsdale House

It was moved by Councillor Elliot, seconded by Councillor Kinsella to grant a Noise By-Law exemption to midnight on the dates July 15, 2017 and July 22, 2017 to the Hillsdale House Inn. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-MAY-15-04 Proclamation for the Lions Club 60th Anniversary

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella, seconded by Councillor Sanford to approve the request to make a proclamation for the Lions Clubs Centennial Celebration and recognize the 60th anniversary of Annapolis Royal Lions Club. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2017-MAY-15-05 Jerri Costa and Wayne Morgan Honorary Citizenship

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella, seconded by Councillor Sanford that Jerri Costa and Wayne Morgan be declared honoree citizens of Annapolis Royal. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-MAY-15-06 Public Payphone in Front of Town Hall

It was moved by Councillor Sanford, seconded by Councillor Elliot to approve to retain the one public pay phone in front of the Town Hall at the cost of up to \$50 per month. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-MAY-15-07 All Candidates Meeting

It was moved by Councillor Elliot, seconded by Councillor Kinsella to direct staff to attempt to organize an all candidates meeting in conjunction with ABOT prior to the Provincial Election, subject to candidates' availability. **Motion Carried.** 1 Nay Vote Deputy Mayor Power.

MOTION #C2017-MAY-15-08 Interest Write-Off

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Kinsella that Council approve to write-off the interest charges on tax account #01031678 in the amount of \$87.36. **Motion Carried.** 1 Nay Vote Deputy Mayor Power

MOTION #C2017-MAY-15-09 Tax Write-Off

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella, seconded by Councillor Sanford that Council approve to write-off role #0092398 and role #04997409 interim taxes in the amounts \$660.83 and \$2422.35 respectively for the Town of Annapolis Royal. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-MAY-15-10 Provincial Capital Assistance Program Contribution, Lequille Water Reservoir

It was moved by Councillor Sanford, seconded by Councillor Elliot that Council approve to accept the 50% contribution under the Provincial Capital Assistance Program, up to a maximum of \$150,000, for the rehabilitation of the Lequille Water Reservoir as outlined in the recommendation from Hatch dated July 12, 2016 and to proceed with the project based on the updated estimated total cost of \$401,919. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-MAY-15-11 Adult Gym Equipment Disposal

It was moved by Councillor Elliot seconded by Deputy Mayor Power that Council approve to direct Noah Scanlan to dispose of the outdoor adult gym equipment either by selling or donating it to a group with the condition that a contract outlining the safety concerns of the equipment be included, or sell for scrap metal. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-MAY-15-12 Tancook Whaler Funds

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power seconded by Councillor Kinsella that Council approve a maximum of \$15K previously allocated to ARCAC to be used for the completion of the Tancook Whaler with the intention that the boat to be sold and the proceeds used to fund a second boat. **Motion Carried.** 1 Nay Vote Councillor Elliot

MOTION #C2017-MAY-15-14 Historic Gardens Free Canada Day Admission

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella, seconded by Councillor Sanford that Council encourage the Historic Gardens to have a donations only admission day on Canada Day and the Town will top up the difference to the maximum of \$2000 from the Communities, Culture and Heritage grant. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-MAY-15-15 Establishing the Investment Committee

It was moved by Councillor Sanford, seconded by Councillor Elliot that Council approve to establish the Investment Committee. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-MAY-15-16 Friends of the Library Book Sale at King's Theatre Plaza

It was moved by Councillor Elliot, seconded by Deputy Mayor Power that Council approve that the Town offer space at the King's Theatre plaza for the Friends of the Library to hold a book sale twice a month for June, July and August and the Town waive the Vender application fee. **Motion Carried.**
