MOTIONS FROM COUNCIL: June 19, 2017 (From Unapproved Minutes. Approval of minutes will occur at the next Council meeting)

MOTION #C2017-JUN-19-04 By-law Exemption for June 30th Music at the Amphitheatre

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella, seconded by Councillor Sanford to approve a noise by-law exemption for June 30th until 11 pm to accommodate the afternoon of music at the amphitheatre and beer garden for the Canada 150 celebrations. **Motion Carried**.

MOTION #C2017-JUN-19-05 Appointment to the Investment Committee

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Kinsella that Council approve Councillor Owen Elliot and Councillor John Kinsella for the Investment Committee. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-JUN-19-06 Water Testing Policy

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella, seconded by Councillor Sanford that Council approve the updated water testing policy. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-JUN-19-07 Friends of the Library Book Sale

It was moved by Councillor Sanford, seconded by Councillor Elliot that Council approve the Friends of the Library the use of King's Theatre plaza for the dates of September 2, 2017 and October 7, 2017 for the book sale and waive the vender application fee. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-JUN-19-08 Negotiations on Invoices Elm Tree A-15 and Elm Tree A-21

It was moved by Councillor Elliot, seconded by Deputy Mayor Power that CAO Barr enter into negotiations with the homeowner on the invoices Elm Tree A-15 and Elm Tree A-21 with a counter offer of \$1750. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-JUN-19-09 Street Closure for Natal Day Street Dance

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Kinsella that Council grant the Natal Day Committee permission to close St George Street from 5pm to midnight from Victoria Street to Drury Lane for a street dance on Friday August 4, 2017 and the public be informed of the by-law exemption in the July Town Crier. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-JUN-19-10 Suspension of August Meetings

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella, seconded by Councillor Sanford that Council suspend regular August Council and subcommittee meetings with the provision that a special meeting can be called in the event of a pressing matter. **Motion**

MOTION #C2017-JUN-19-11 Write-Off of Mortgage Fees

It was moved by Councillor Sanford, seconded by Councillor Elliot that Council write off \$40.00 in mortgage fees for roll 02397919 as of March 31, 2017 (\$20 in 2015 and \$20 in 2016) as there was no mortgage on this property. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-JUN-19-12 Budget Increase for Waterfront Development Project

It was moved by Councillor Elliot, seconded by Deputy Mayor Power that Council approve a budget increase of \$51,000 for the waterfront development project, primarily as a result of unanticipated environmental remediation at the Petit Parc location, and that the funds be drawn from capital reserve. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-JUN-19-13 Safety Strip on Walkway on Staircase Leading to Beach Access

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Kinsella that Council direct public works staff to install a safety strip on the step on the walkway to the staircase leading to the beach access stairs. **Motion Carried.**

MOTION #C2017-JUN-19-14 Installation of Second Railing on Staircase Leading to Beach Access

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Kinsella that Council authorize the installation of a second railing on the steps to the staircase leading to the beach access to a maximum of \$1500 from the Capital Reserve. **Motion Carried**.

Did you know?

In British Columbia, residents guzzle 1.2 million litres of beer over the country's birthday long weekend.

In 2010, Canada toughened up its citizenship test with more detailed questions and a higher pass mark. As a result, failure rates jumped from between four and eight per cent to 30.

86% of Canadians believe they live in the best country in the world.

To help them design the country's official flag, parliamentarians asked Canadians in 1963 to draft suggestions. Of the 3,541 patriots who responded, nearly 400 thought a beaver should be front and centre, while one trippy submission depicted the disembodied heads of the four Beatles encircling a fleur-de-lys

Canadians officially referred to July 1 as Dominion Day until 1982, when 13 sleepy Members of Parliament voted in the name change at 4 p.m. on a Friday, before declaring the rest of the afternoon a holiday and taking off.

Color T.V. was first introduced in Canada on Canada Day in 1967

"O Canada" became the official National Anthem in 1980



Update on the Academy Condos

If you have wondered about the large piles of dirt recently surrounding the Academy building on St. George Street, it's just the next phase in the total reconstruction of ARRA into what will become 39 modern condominiums.

"The early part of the renovation which took place late last year and early this year was largely inside" explained builder Tim Tanner, Owner and Developer for Jacob Tanner Development, Inc. "Now that weather permits, there is more emphasis on outside construction and that includes a lot of excavation, creating, as you may have noticed, several large piles of dirt. They are the result of holes dug to accommodate the second and third floor deck supports and the first floor sunken patios.

"The recent major digging was for the first floor units at the front of the building, all four of which are below grade level. To keep these units more in touch with the outdoors," Tanner said, "we excavated for and built what we call 'Walpinis', subterranean extensions of these units, boxed in concrete, with ground level roofs made mostly of glass. In effect, greenhouses. It has been a huge project and accounted for most of the out front piles of dirt for the past few weeks. Most of that mess has now been cleaned up.

"The final dirt pile projects include creating 92 parking spaces to accommodate owners, their guests plus visitors to the gym and library. And finally, there is the mysterious culvert that runs from the building to a spot well out onto the front lawn. It is the beginnings of a large fountain which should be completed before the end of summer.

"We will continue to provide these updates until the project is completed, sometime in late summer or early fall. We are delighted at the opportunity to preserve this building that means so much to so many in the area. And we deeply appreciate the support this project has enjoyed from the town. We can promise all a very attractive and valuable addition to the landscape of Annapolis Royal."
