Rose Fortune continues to have her mark on history honoured. On January 12th, Catherine McKenna, Minister Responsible for Parks Canada, announced that Rose Fortune is being recognized as a person of national historic significance in Canada. Quite the honour to be bestowed and certainly well deserved.

Annapolis Royal has certainly been a winter wonderland this year - starting with a white Christmas, followed by a series of snow events, some of which qualified as squalls and blizzards. An Announcement from Health Canada

Did you know that radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer? Long term exposure to high levels of radon can increase a person's risk, especially if they smoke.

November was [Radon Action Month](#), Health Canada is encouraging all Canadians to become aware of this potential health risk and take steps (if necessary) to mitigate exposure. For information on radon, including how to obtain a test kit, visit our [website](#).

Quick facts:

- [Radon](#) is a radioactive gas that is found naturally in the environment and is undetectable by smell, sight, or taste.
- It can seep into a home through cracks in the foundation, pipe openings, and other places where a house is open to the ground.
- The only way to know if it is there is through a simple and inexpensive test.
- You may purchase a ["do it yourself" kit](#), or hire a professional (consult the [National Radon Proficiency Program](#) to find out more).
- Health Canada recommends that homes be tested for a minimum of three months, ideally between September and April when windows and doors are kept closed.
- If your home tests above the Canadian Radon Guideline of 200 Becquerels per cubic metre (200 Bq/m³), it is recommended that you take action to reduce your exposure.

CHIEF'S CORNER



Well, winter arrived on Christmas and seems to have stayed – I am talking about the amount of snow we have received so far. We are moving into our third month of winter and we have a few more weeks to go. I love winter and snow as much as the rest, but I want to remind people to drive according to the weather conditions. It's not about how well your vehicle can drive in the snow so much as it is how well it can stop! And please, take a few minutes to brush the snow from your vehicle. You can't avoid hazards on the road if you can't see them. If driving for a long distance take a break every hour or two and clean off your vehicle as snow tends to build up on the back end and often covers your rear lights.

As a friendly reminder, the speed limit within the town is 50km/hr, with two exceptions: it is 40 km/hr in the lower part of town, which is everywhere southwest of Prince Albert Road; and 60 km/hr on Prince Albert Road west of the Home Hardware rear entrance. If you are exceeding these limits do not be surprised when one of our members stops to have a chat with you. This includes St. George Street – although not a school zone, there are several young children who line the street to be picked up by a school bus in the morning and are then dropped off in the early afternoon. Please drive safely.

Now for something a little lighter – this is for Dr. Simon Bonnington: Mix 1- 1 ½ cups of flour and two eggs in a bowl – add a bit of milk and stir until you obtain a consistency a little heavier than pancake mix. Boil some water and using a fork, place portions of the dough in the pot and boil each until it floats. Remove from water and place in a bowl – add butter, salt, and a bit of sour cream for topping. We call it a dumpling. You're welcome – enjoy. Chef Moser.

Snow Clearing of Sidewalks

With all the snow that has fallen this winter, it has been difficult for people to keep on top of shoveling sidewalks. In order to keep the sidewalks as safe as possible for all, we want to offer a friendly reminder of the by-law concerning sidewalk snow removal.

“Town of Annapolis Royal By-Law #103 refers to the responsibility of owners, occupiers or persons in charge of houses, stores, lots and pieces of land situate on St. George Street from Dargie’s Plaza to the Government Wharf in respect to the clearing of snow and ice from sidewalks. The Town is responsible for the maintenance of the remainder of the Town sidewalks.

However, to facilitate the overall removal of heavy snowfall amounts in the area referred to in the By-Law, the Town will at times clear snow from this area.”
