A heartfelt welcome to all new and returning visitors to Annapolis Royal. We appreciate the opportunity to share our proud heritage and unparalleled quality of life, and I encourage you to 'stay another day' so that you're able to enjoy everything that our remarkable town and its citizens have to offer.

Recognized as the 'cradle of our nation' for its prominent role in the origins of Canada, Annapolis Royal is situated on the ancestral territory of Mi'kma'ki, who occupied the land for thousands of years. Canada's first permanent European settlement was established by the French at nearby Port-Royal in 1605, with these lands becoming the most fought over in North America as European empires struggled for control. Our town site served as the colonial capitals of France, Scotland, and Great Britain.

The capital of Nova Scotia until the establishment of Halifax in 1749, Annapolis Royal is designated as a National Historic District and remains influential as a leader in heritage preservation. The town showcases more than 130 designated heritage buildings and several national historic sites. It is my belief that a visit to the historic town of Annapolis Royal should be on everyone's bucket list, most certainly on the bucket list of every Canadian.

CHIEF'S CORNER



Summer is here and where else would you possibly want to be other than Annapolis Royal? I would like to remind you of a few special events that will see many visitors come to our community. The Special Olympics Torch Run will visit our town on July 27th. Athletes will run from the fire hall to the amphitheatre and a small celebration will close the event. Expect to see a large police presence as there will be members from the many agencies involved in this event in usual support of the Special Olympics. Natal Day, among other events, will see a large contingent of Cadets parading in a "Freedom of the Town" ceremony.

We in policing are in the business of public safety so by default that is priority one for us. However, we are also members of the community and have a vested interest. Not only is it critical for our members to know the people in our community, it is important for our community to know its police and feel comfortable enough to approach and feel relaxed around them. As such, you have already seen an increased presence in foot and bicycle patrols by our members and this will continue to increase during the summer months. You will also see an augmented police presence with three auxiliary constables as well as two students from the Ravensburg College Law and Security Program. I expect my members to engage with the public in a positive manner and I would also encourage you to engage your police officers in the same way.

In order to be an effective police service changes have to occur that are hopefully in a progressive manner. In order to be successful at this style of policing, we need to know and hear from our community - both your needs and concerns. We do this in a variety of ways but the end result is that we must be flexible to make changes that benefit the community as a whole while remaining within the framework of the law. As your newly appointed Traffic Authority, I am committed to working with you and the Traffic Flow Advisory Committee in dealing with issues that are important to ensuring a relatively smooth flow of traffic within the town. Some changes may appear new but some could remind you of that "déjà vu" look. Please be flexible and have patience if changes occur and be assured that due process has been conducted before they do happen.

On a personal note, I want to thank Constable Nicole Cleaves for looking after things while I was on leave. Unfortunately, my leave was extended after suffering an off-duty injury. I also want to thank Constables Jon Theriault and Josh Boreland for stepping up during this difficult time. Additionally, I want to thank the members of Town including council, staff, the Board of Police Commissioners, and the many friends and community members for their support and help. A special thanks to staff at the Annapolis Valley Regional Hospital and Health Facility. Finally, I want to thank my family, especially my wife, for being there during these hard times.

COUNCIL MOTIONS

Council June 18, 2018 and Special Council June 21, 2018 (From Unapproved Minutes. Approval of minutes will occur at the next Council Meeting)

COUNCIL JUNE 18, 2018:

MOTION #C2018-JUNE-18-03

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Sanford to approve \$3,000.00 toward remediation and additional work being done at the soccer field by AWEC. **Motion carried. (One nay vote—Mayor MacDonald).**

MOTION #C2018-JUNE-18-04

It was moved by Councillor Sanford, seconded by Deputy Mayor Power to approve installation of a rainbow crosswalk from King's Theatre Plaza to the Farmers Market Square using line marking as recommended by the Traffic Authority. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JUNE-18-05

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Sanford for noise exemption to be approved until midnight for the dates of August 4th, 11th, and September 15th on behalf of the Queen Anne Inn in view of the fact that the fees have been paid and as outlined in the Noise Exemption By-law. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JUNE-18-06

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Sanford to provide a letter of support to the Municipality of the District of Digby supporting an application to the FCM Climate Change Staff Grant. **Motion carried.**

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Sanford that the actual expenditures be approved to be \$10,000.00 for Canada Days events provided that the extra \$2500.00 is obtained through alternative sources of funding and/or cost savings. **Motion carried.**

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Sanford to direct MEDC to re-open the discussion of the merits of joining the Valley REN. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JUNE-18-11

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Sanford to rescind **MOTION #C2018-MAY-22-11**, “that staff implement a curbside yard waste disposal service as recommended and take the necessary steps to discontinue the use of the current yard waste disposal site”. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JUNE-18-12

It was moved by Councillor Sanford, seconded by Deputy Mayor Power to agree to hold a public consultation for the Leaf and Yard Waste issue at the same time as the intersection at Highway 1 and St. Anthony Street and at that point to put a long-term solution in place. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JUNE-18-13

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Sanford to approve the Water Utility and Water Capital budgets for 2018/2019 as presented. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JUNE-18-14

It was moved by Councillor Sanford, seconded by Deputy Mayor Power to agree that the vacant seat for Housing Nova Scotia Board - 3 year term - be advertised. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JUNE-18-15

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Sanford that Council agree that staff lobby the Government of Nova Scotia by way of letter that public consumption of cannabis legislation not fall to the municipality, but that it be a provincial standard, as with alcohol. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JUNE-18-16

It was moved by Councillor Sanford, seconded by Deputy Mayor Power to approve a \$50.00 a month reduction in rent for the Annapolis Royal and Area Food Bank during the renovation period to a maximum of six months. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JUNE-18-17

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Sanford to agree to suspend regular August Council and subcommittee meetings with the provision that a special meeting can be called in the event of a pressing matter. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JUNE-18-18

It was moved by Councillor Sanford, seconded by Deputy Mayor Power to appoint CAO, Gregory Barr, to negotiate on behalf of the Town of Annapolis Royal regarding the withdrawal of the County of Annapolis from the Valley Region Solid Waste-Resource Management Authority, in accordance with section 32 of the Inter-Municipal Service Agreement. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JUNE-18-19

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Sanford to approve \$500.00 for costs for a port-a-potty located at AWEC sports fields for the 2018 season, utilizing available funds from the Facilities Maintenance and repair budget. **Motion carried.**

It was moved by Councillor Sanford, seconded by Deputy Mayor Power that Council issue a letter of support to the Municipality of the District of Digby for the completion of Highway 101 Digby to Weymouth, Phase 2 Funding. **Motion carried.**

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Sanford that the Town apply for the Beautification and Streetscaping Program grant with the Department of Municipal Affairs. **Motion carried.**
