WHAT'S UP ANNAPOLIS?



It's here! The biggest weekend of the year is once again upon us. Annapolis Royal is THE place to be for the Natal Day long weekend. This year is set to be one of the biggest yet. There will be a street dance, beer garden, lots of entertainment for kids, and of course, the fireworks. As a special treat, this year Her Majesty's Canadian Ship (HMCS) Acadia Cadet Training Centre will celebrate its Freedom of the Town with a street parade through downtown Annapolis Royal on Sunday, August 5 at 6pm.

Granted by Annapolis Royal to HMCS Acadia in 2004, Freedom of the Town is a historic tradition signifying a town's trust in a military unit, organization or dignitary and serves as a welcome to visit the town at leisure. The streets will be lined with over 700 cadets and staff of HMCS Acadia participating in the Freedom of the Town.

The regular Sunset Ceremony with the Cadets will take place at Fort Anne between 8pm-9pm. This is followed by fireworks at dusk (10pm). The location of the fireworks will be the Annapolis Royal Wharf. Good vantage points include Fort Anne, Queen's Wharf, the amphitheatre, and the boardwalk.



COUNCIL MOTIONS



Council Motions from July 16, 2018 (From Unapproved Minutes. Approval of minutes will occur at the next Council Meeting)

MOTION #C2018-JULY-16-03

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella, seconded by Deputy Mayor Power to approve the \$3,000 cost associated with the AIM Network & FCM Municipal Asset Management Program, to be paid over the 2018/2019 and 2019/2020 fiscal years, and to approve the transfer of \$1,500 from the operating reserve for the 2018/2019 payment. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-IULY-16-04

It was moved Councillor Kinsella, seconded by Councillor Sanford to accept the tender bid from Tusket Sales & Services LTD., for the purchase of a 2019 plow/dump truck for Public Works at the price of \$66,463 + HST. This price includes a trade in value of \$18,000.00 from the current 2008 F550 1 Ton Truck. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JULY-16-05

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Kinsella that council initiate a dedication of the middle swing at the playground to Gwynneth Thompson with the following text; "You are invited to share Gwynnie's swing". **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JULY-16-06

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella, seconded by Councillor Sanford to approve the Capital Investment Plan for the next five years beginning in 2018. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JULY-16-07

It was moved by Councillor Sanford, seconded by Councillor Elliot to approve the operating budget for the year ending March 31, 2019 for Valley Waste. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JULY-16-10

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella, seconded by Councillor Sanford to approve the capital budget for the year ending March 31, 2019 for Valley Waste. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JULY-16-08

It was moved by Councillor Elliot, seconded by Deputy Mayor that we approve a cooperative project between the Annapolis Board of Trade and the Town of Annapolis Royal to do an additional compost pick—up for restaurants bi-weekly until mid-October as a pilot project, contingent on the participation of the Annapolis Board of Trade. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JULY-16-09

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Kinsella that council recommends that a letter be forwarded on behalf of council regarding the Town of Shelburne's request for support relating to the Disaster Mitigation and Adaptation Fund. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JULY-16-11

It was moved by Councillor Sanford, seconded Councillor Sanford that council grants the Natal Day Committee permission to close St. George Street at 5:30 pm from Victoria Street to Drury Lane for a street dance on Friday August 3, 2018 and the public be informed of the street closure in the Town Crier. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JULY-16-11

It was moved by Councillor Sanford, seconded by Councillor Elliot that we give SOFAAR permission to use the King's Theatre boardwalk plaza space every second Wednesday and Saturday during the Market season. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JULY-16-12

It was moved Councillor Elliot, seconded by Deputy Mayor Power to continue with the start time at 4pm for Council meetings for the next six months on an ongoing trial basis. **Motion carried. One nay vote - Councillor Elliot.**

MOTION #C2018-JULY-16-13

It was moved by Deputy Mayor, seconded by Councillor Kinsella that the applicant at 204 St. Anthony Street be given heritage approval to add a wood corner trim, wood window trim, skirt board and heat pump as detailed in the application AR18-023-HER, providing the requirements of the Land Use By-Law are met. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JULY-16-15

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella, seconded by Councillor Sanford that the applicant at 494 St. George street be given heritage approval in principal to add the addition to the rear of the building in keeping with the character of the building design, as detailed in the application AR18-022-HER, and subject to submitting detailed construction drawings meet the intent of approval by the municipal heritage staff, and providing the requirements of the Land Use By-Law are met. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JULY-16-16

It was moved by Councillor Sanford, seconded by Councillor Elliot that the applicant at 494 St. George Street be given heritage approval to replace the 49 wood windows to vinyl inserts as detailed in the application AR18-022-HER subject to Council receiving a quote on the cost of the restoration of the windows. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JULY-16-14

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella, seconded by Councillor Sanford to issue the Request for Proposals for the Design and Recommendations for Town Wayfinding System and Signage in January 2019 with the updated deadline of February 8, 2019. **Motion carried.**

MOTION #C2018-JULY-16-17

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power, seconded by Councillor Kinsella that Mayor MacDonald be appointed as an alternate as the commercial representative for the Condo Board Association. **Motion carried.**
