The Town's Board of Police Commissioners has an immediate opening for the Department of Justice (DoJ) appointee position on the Board. It is a three year term position and the appointee is determined by the DoJ. All applications are made [online](#), directly to DoJ.

The function of the Board is to provide civilian governance on behalf of council in relation to the enforcement of law, the maintenance of law and order, and the prevention of crime in the municipality, as well as the administrative direction, organization and policy required to maintain an efficient and adequate police force.

The Town's Board of Police Commissioners meets once a month, on a Wednesday at 9am.
