money, without which the vision of this important community space could not have been realized.






Get on the Ban Wagon

St. George and St. Andrew United Church and Miller's Independent Grocery in Annapolis Royal wish to thank everyone in Annapolis Royal that contributed to the "Get on the BAN Wagon" bag bin that was located at the store for two weeks. Over 450 reusable bags, contributed and collected jointly by the store and the church's Church in Action Committee, have been distributed to shoppers to replace the single-use plastic bags they had been using.





We will keep the bin open until the bags disappear and will continue to try to bring attention to the negative impact of single-use plastics through other projects and strategies. Remember single-use plastics threaten wildlife and affect human health.



Provincial Conservation Advice and Conservation Work Grants and the Tax Rebate Grants Announcement

Owners of a registered municipal heritage property may apply for a conservation advice grant to support up to 50% of the costs to prepare the conservation advice report, up to a maximum of \$3,000.

Only registered municipal heritage properties used either for <u>religious worship</u> or <u>community</u>, <u>non-profit purposes</u> are eligible, and may apply for a conservation work grant to support up to 50% of the eligible conservation work costs up to a maximum of \$7,500 every two years.

The deadlines are March 15th and May 15th. After May 15th, submitted applications will be assessed based on date of receipt and the program's fiscal ability. Final reports are due by November 15, 2019. Should you have any questions on these grants or would like to obtain an application form and guideline document, please contact 1-902-424-5647.

Service Nova Scotia continues to offer a Provincial Tax Rebate. This program provides heritage property owners a full rebate of the provincial sales tax paid for eligible materials used for the repair, improvement or restoration of the exterior of a heritage property. Annapolis Royal Student Earns Loran Award

Annapolis Royal's very own Finn Hafting, student at Annapolis West Education Centre, has been selected as a Loran Scholar – one of 35 recipients of Canada's most comprehensive undergraduate scholarship for character, commitment to service in the community, and leadership.

This is a prestigious award and is valued at \$100,000 over four years of undergraduate study, including a \$10,000 annual stipend, tuition waivers, mentorship, summer internship funding, an orientation expedition in Algonquin Park as well as annual retreats and forums.

More than 5000 students applied this year, and the top 88 finalists travelled to Toronto for national selections whereby 35 were selected for the award. Congratulations, Finn, on a truly remarkable accomplishment.

Need Assistance with Income Taxes?

Spring might not be here yet but income tax time is! Would you like to get your tax return filed for free quickly and conveniently? Depending on your financial situation, we might be able to prepare and file your tax return electronically, for free. The Canada Revenue Agency sponsors a program called the Community Volunteer Income Tax Program (CVITP), a free tax preparation service for people with a modest income and a simple tax situation. This year we got a "raise" and the income criteria amounts have been increased to an individual with an income under \$35,000 and a couple with a combined income of under \$45,000. Please be aware, however, that we are not permitted to file returns for people who operate a small business, have employment expenses to claim, or rental income. We will be offering drop-in tax preparation clinics every Monday from 1pm-3pm during the months of March and April, weather permitting. Clinics will be held at the United Church in Annapolis Royal, by the traffic lights—please use the side door with the veranda. As we inch closer to warmer weather we are reminded that it is a time when many people start to become more active, which includes increased vehicle and pedestrian traffic within town. Please be mindful of speed limits and traffic regulations as they relate to these concerns.

You may note some minor changes with some traffic signage or highway markings that are designed to amplify the general rules of the road. While we like to be close to our destination for convenience I want to


remind you that it is for the safety of drivers and pedestrians alike that we have these rules including prohibited parking; within 5 metres of a fire hydrant or crosswalk, 7.5 metres from an intersection, or 10 metres of a stop sign. It may sound like common sense however these are the most common parking related violations that we see in town. These violations can cause drivers to "go around" the offending vehicle and by doing so head into oncoming traffic or obscure the line of sight for driver or pedestrians to see each other. I would also like to remind you that leaving your vehicle running while unattended is a violation of the motor vehicle act and contrary to our Town "No Idling" policy.

Many of you already know that our CAO, Greg Barr, has moved onto another position with the County of Kings, and I want to wish him the best of luck in his new position. I think I can speak for everyone at the Town Hall that he will be greatly missed.

I would also like to send a big shout out to the members of the Annapolis Royal Volunteer Fire Department for the hard work and commitment to our community. Not just for the everyday calls for service they respond to but the exorbitant amount of volunteer time put into "Chase the Ace". At the time of this writing, the ace of spades has not been picked so good luck to everyone or congratulations to the winner, whichever the case may be.
