WHAT'S UP ANNAPOLIS?



The Town of Annapolis Royal is *springing* into action with exciting changes!

As heard first at the April 23rd funding announcement, the Town has received funding from Atlantic Canada Opportunities Agency (ACOA) of \$175,000.00, \$110,000 from Nova Scotia Tourism Revitalization of Icons Program (NSTRIP) and \$10,000 from the Annapolis Royal Farmers' and Traders' Market Society.

With these funds the Farmers' Market Roof and Comfort Station projects will perpetuate. Thank you to everyone who has invested their time thus far in the funding application process, designing and organizing of these substantial projects.

The addition of the Farmers' and Traders' Market roof will allow for the extension of the market season from early spring to late fall protecting merchants, shoppers and browsers from the elements. While the Comfort Station will provide barrier free public washrooms and amenities to visitors and residence alike.

Speaking of additions, welcome to our new CAO, Kelly Rice; and thanks to everyone who came to the Open House on April 12th to welcome her.

MAYOR'S MESSAGE





Spring is bringing traffic flow changes to the Town of Annapolis Royal to improve resident and visitor safety, amidst an ever increasing vehicle traffic flow on our streets. Most notably, these traffic flow improvements will include the installation of a three-way stop at the intersection of St. Anthony and Victoria Street by the Post Office - with that portion of St. Anthony Street from Victoria Street to St. George Street being made into a one-way with new stop signs installed.

With the installation of this one-way, vehicles traveling on St. George Street will no longer be permitted to turn right onto St. Anthony Street. Vehicles traveling on St. George Street will still able to turn right at St. James - the very next street.

These public safety improvements were recommended to Council by the Town's Traffic Flow Advisory Committee, based on expert advice and recommendations received from Hatch Engineering - after their study of traffic flow patterns in the area.

The Traffic Flow Committee is comprised of members of Council, the Superintendent of Public Works, and the Chief of Police as the Traffic Authority.

While Council recognizes that it may take some time for drivers to get use to these changes, and that some may not support them, these changes are made in the interests of public safety, - Council's primary concern in every traffic flow decisions. Everyone's patience is appreciated, as we all get use to these traffic flow changes once in place.

CHIEF'S CORNER



While "Old Man Winter" gave us a few surprises in April I think we can all agree "that" part of the season is now over and we are now firmly into the warmer part of Spring. By all accounts the great Easter Eggstravaganza was an exciting time for the many kids and parents who participated in the egg hunt. Unfortunately, Chief Bunny was not able to make an appearance this year but I have heard that he will there next year. Stay Tuned!

As we start to enjoy the nicer weather it also means that more people, locals and visitors alike, will be heading into town for planned events or to visit the beautiful scenery including the blossoming Magnolia trees. I would like to remind you to

Chief T.G. (Tim) Moser think safety first as spring activities bring about more pedestrian and bicycle traffic. Also be attentive to basic traffic laws and parking restrictions as we move into the summer months and peak tourist season.

Parking has been, and I predict it will continue to be, a sensitive issue as more people come into town during peak season. If you are a resident, business owner, or an employee working in town, I encourage you to walk into the core area if you are able. This would greatly assist in freeing up parking spaces on the main roads for visitors, shoppers and those with mobility challenges.

Recently, one of our police officers responded to a 911 call of a male in crisis, which subsequently led to a physical confrontation. Both the male and Officer sustained injuries however I am happy to report that neither were serious in nature. Citizens on scene provided assistance to the Officer and their actions helped to deescalate the situation preventing more serious injuries from occurring. I bring this up for two reasons: 1) we are not immune from these types of calls in or around Annapolis Royal, which is why we maintain standards and possess certain tools and equipment; and 2) it is very comforting to know that ordinary citizens are willing to help without question when needed. Please keep all first responders in your thoughts and prayers, community support is critical and very much appreciated particularly in times of crisis.

Finally, I would like to send out best wishes to our new Town Chief Administrative Officer, Kelly Rice and look forward to working with her over the years to come – congratulations and welcome to this great community.

Budget Decisions

This year Council has had to make some difficult decisions in regard to the budget. Over the past 15 years, we have been very fortunate that we have not had to increase the residential and commercial tax rates in the Town, however with the ever increasing costs related to running the Town we are forced to put an increase in place to balance the budget. Council has adopted a \$0.05/ mil increase in both our residential and commercial tax rate effective April 1, 2019 resulting in the new rates of \$1.70 residential and \$3.20 commercial.

Smoking Restrictions in the Town

Mayor and Council have requested Town staff to prepare a draft bylaw for Council's consideration - that expands smoking restrictions in the Town of Annapolis Royal. Including, on and within a specified distance of sidewalks and other town owned property.

Currently, smoking in outdoor areas of the town is restricted by the provincial 'Nova Scotia Smoke Free Places Act'. Specifically:

1.On or within 20 meters of playgrounds located in an outdoor space; 2. On or within 20 meters of publicly owned sport and recreation event or venue; 3. On or within 9 meters of public trails; 4. In provincial parks and on provincial beaches, except within the boundaries of a rented campsite; 5. School grounds; 6. All outdoor licensed areas, patios of all restaurants, lounges, beverage rooms, and cabarets are to be smoke free; and 7. No smoking within 4 meters of windows, air intake vents, and entrances to places of employment. -ce**to**n-
