## MAYOR'S MESSAGE





June 21st marked the summer solstice, the longest day of the year, and annual observance of National Indigenous Peoples Day in

A time of celebration, it is also a time of reflection. A celebration of First Nations heritage and culture from coast, to coast, to coast - that also recognizes hard truths about a colonial legacy that continues to harm and impact relationships between indigenous and non-indigenous people.

In claiming this place as the cradle of our nation, we are speaking of a nation of people - not a construct of boundaries or politics. A

nation of people that arose out of those who gathered upon these very lands. From the Mi'kmaq who occupied these lands for thousands of years, and with other first people are the foundation of our nation, to all those across the centuries who gathered here under a diversity of flags and beliefs.

Politics created the Dominion of Canada in 1867 - and regrettably enshrined a colonial posture of supremacy over indigenous people. Canada needs to reconcile its relationship with indigenous people, and reject any remnants of colonial prejudice or discrimination in its policies and practices.

Well, no one says that change is easy, but we can all agree that change is constant. Of course, I am referring to the recent traffic change to Victoria, St Anthony, and St George Streets. We have been monitoring this area since the change and have issued several verbal warnings for those who have been driving in auto- mode. Please be aware that you are responsible for your driving and need to be vigilant particularly when it comes to traffic signs whether permanent or temporary. Also, basic rules of the road apply with respect to any intersection with more than one stop sign. As new drivers you would have learned about "Right of Way". When stopping at an intersection where more than one stop sign is

posted "Right of Way" is giving to the first person who reached the stop sign. If you reach the intersection at the same time as someone else – you must "Yield Right of Way" to the person on

your right. Please be aware of your surroundings and obey all traffic signs particularly at St George and St Anthony Street where there are 3 crosswalks and a reduced line of sight. Failure to stop at a stop sign can result in a fine of \$180 for the first offence and loss of points. This includes "rolling through a stop sign".

Matt is replacing Constable Sarah ROBICHEAU who left us for Kentville Police Service at the end of June. Matt hails from the Halifax area and is a recent graduate of the Atlantic Police Academy. #### Council May 21, 2019 (From Approved Minutes)

#### MOTION #C2019-MAY-21-04

Councillor Kinsella moved council approval of Valley Waste Capital and Operating Budget; Deputy Mayor Power seconded for purpose of discussion.

Budget Discussion Ensued. Motion Carried.

#### MOTION #C2019-MAY-21-05

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella and seconded by Councillor Sanford to recommend that council adopt the changes to the Facility Usage/ Rental Policy No 2018-12 and the subsequent appendices. **Motion Carried**.

#### MOTION #C2019-MAY-21-06

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella and seconded by Councillor Sanford to support the King's Theatre washroom up to \$2,000. **Motion Carried.** 

#### MOTION #C2019-MAY-21-07

It was moved by Deputy Mayor Power and seconded by Councillor Kinsella to write-off roll 00092398 and roll 04997409 interim taxes in the amounts \$680.85 and \$2,419.20 respectively for the Town of Annapolis Royal's Town owned properties. **Motion Carried.**

It was moved by Councillor Sanford and seconded by Councillor Kinsella that the applicant at 170 St George Street be given heritage approval to install a projecting wall sign as detailed in the application AR19-010-HER, providing the requirements of the Land Use By-Law are met. **Motion Carried.** 

#### MOTION #C2019-MAY-21-09

It was moved by Councillor Kinsella and seconded by Councillor Sanford that the applicant at 18 St James Street be given heritage approval to relocate the current shed, add a new work shed 12' x 20' and increase the footprint of the back ell including the use of wooden windows and doors, as detailed in the application AR19-011-HER, providing the requirements of the Land Use By-Law are met. **Motion Carried.**

It was Moved by Deputy Mayor Power and seconded by Councillor Kinsella to table the motion until Councillor Elliot, Chair of the Board of Police Commissioners has an opportunity to provide input on the new design of Police branding. **Motion Carried.**

Discussion ensued.




