

Police Statistics for the Month of JULY

August, I am happy to say that our calls for service were generally minor

While the traditional summer months are over, we still have a few more weeks of actual summer left and hopefully extended pleasant weather as we approach the beginning of fall. Suffice it to say that we had a splendid July and August

From a police and safety perspective, although we had a busy July and August, I am happy to say that our calls for service were generally minor in nature. However, it was disappointing to see a spike in impaired driving offences. Quite frankly, it is shocking that this continues to be a social problem particularly when we all know the consequences of impaired driving. Most importantly because of the grief it causes people

when injuries and deaths occur from alcohol and/or drug related driving - not to mention the legal consequences to those who cause these and/or are charged with impaired driving offences. This is everyone's responsibility! If you can prevent a person from driving impaired, you need to take action — stop them from getting into their vehicle if you are able and/or call police immediately. You could be saving a life.

On a lighter note: while there were many fun activities during Natal Day weekend, the fireworks were amazing. I can't tell you how much fun was had by all at the Splash Mob where many children had the opportunity to soak me and an even better target "dare I say" – the Mayor! What a blast – no pun intended. This is definitely an event to watch for next year.



NEW LOOK! Sometime in September, you will notice a change to the Police uniform. Specifically, we will be introducing a new shoulder flash and police identifiers. This change is in line with other agencies and has been done for a variety of reason including the removal of existing high-visibility threading while increasing POLICE identifiers. The new flash will be subdued royal blue and off-white, will bear the maple leaf symbolizing Canada, the Scottish emblem symbolizing our province, and Fort Anne and water waves representing Annapolis Royal. There will be no changes to the Police vehicle markings.

Finally, as we move back into our fall/school routine I want to remind you to remain cognizant of our children safety as they head back to school. This includes both school zones and areas where they are picked up and dropped off by school and public transport.

WHO CAN VOTE?

Under the <i>Municipal Elections Act</i> [s. 14], a person entitled to be registered on the list of electors and to vote in a municipal election must:
\square be 18 years or older on September 14th, 2019;
☐ is a Canadian citizen on the first advance polling day;
\Box have been ordinarily resident in the Province for a period of 6 (six) months immediately preceding the first advance polling day; and
\Box is ordinarily resident in the municipality or in an area annexed to the municipality and to have been so since immediately before the first advance polling day.
Persons who may be regarded as having a mental illness or mental disability are entitled to vote, if they can identify themselves to election officers, and to indicate that they wish to vote.
