

## MAYOR'S MESSAGE

In a recent social media post, I talked about how our community needs to be more than just residents and business owners. Suggesting that we need to be TEAM ANNAPOLIS ROYAL. Seizing upon every opportunity to show compassion towards each other; shop local to support our area businesses; and ensure that every visitor to our community feels welcomed.

Six months into the pandemic and provincial state of emergency, we've now transitioned into what our Chief Public Health Officer has described as 'living with COVID-19 for the foreseeable future'.

In what has been called our new normal, most local businesses are open, albeit operating under capacity and physical distancing restrictions. A steady increase of visitors are in our town, as a result of

The term "natal" is derived from the Latin word for birth and, hence, Natal Day is the official "birthday" of the province.



## CHIEF'S CORNER





Well, in light of the major changes and cancellations due to COVID-19 it is hard to believe that summer is almost half over. It is also hard to believe that I have been your Chief of Police for three years now. Time flies – even in a pandemic.

While things continue to open up a little bit at a time it is still nice to see people visiting our town and partaking in our weekly market, local restaurants, and other social events while respecting the restrictions of social distancing and hygiene. The donning of masks, having become somewhat of a norm, is now mandatory in most indoor venues as science is showing it is another way to reduce the chances of spreading this harmful, and in many cases, deadly virus.

In this new norm, I want to speak about public and social shaming related to people who are within our community particularly with outof-province plates or conversely, those who follow or go beyond the recommended and/or mandated personal protective equipment and

social distancing. Unfortunately, there have been a few occasions where this has occurred and in some - more serious incidents by leaving offensive notes on car windshields, keying vehicles, or committing assaults. I realize that many people are concerned about COVID-19 while others do not seem concerned at all. The main issue is we must rely on our health specialists to get us through these tough times. We don't have to look very far to see what can happen when people become lackadaisical or down right irresponsible. Shaming or committing crimes against others because you "believe" they have not complied is totally unacceptable and subject to criminal charges where applicable. So is assaulting someone because they deny you a service when you don't comply. If you believe someone is not compliant with the health protection order, please contact the health authority or police, who will reach out to these folks. Jumping to conclusion only inflames the situation and is not helpful. In most cases there is simply misunderstanding on what is required and reminding them of their responsibility has been more than adequate.

As per my comments in last months Town Crier, I encourage you to check the Town webpage to confirm changes as the province continues to relax some of the conditions. #### Mandatory Masks in Town Hall

Premier Stephen McNeil and Dr. Robert Strang, Chief Medical Officer of Health for Nova Scotia, announced Friday, July 24, that masks will become mandatory in most indoor public places on July 31st. Municipal and provincial government locations offering services to the public are included on the list. If you are planning to visit Town Hall, we ask you to wear a non-medical mask. #### **Character Defining Elements**

In 2018, the Planning & Heritage Advisory Committee (PHAC) decided to review all the heritage properties that did not have character defining elements listed for the registered property. The character defining elements are the elements that the Committee considers when an application is received for changes. A letter was sent out to all property owners to let them know the Committee had a consultant, to review the files for these properties and propose character defining elements for each one. The consultant has reviewed many properties and PHAC has received 3-4 of the files each month for the last year and has reviewed and made some changes to the character defining elements. On the July 20th Council meeting, it was approved (MOTION #C2020-07-20-09) that the files be added to the website. ### **Traffic Delays**

Just a reminder that you may experience traffic delays at the St. Anthony Intersection due to construction. Improvements are being made to include the Fire Hall entrance on Prince Albert Road, change the angle on the entrance to Fortier Mills Lane, and change the angle and two exits off St Anthony Street on to Prince Albert Road.



#### **Composting Tips**

There are lots of great reasons to compost. It saves money, saves resources, can help to improve your soil and can significantly reduce your impact on the environment. Here are some tips for proper green cart usage:

- In the summer months, reduce odors and increase cart cleanliness by storing the cart in a well ventilated, shady area and cleaning your cart periodically.
- Reduce insect and animal issues by removing as much moisture as possible by draining and wrapping food, and deter insects from around the lid with dish soap, salt or lime.
- When placing especially odorous materials in cart, put them first in an empty cereal box or other box board container and fold over the top or wrap them in two or three sheets of newspaper to seal in odors.
