# 5. PUBLIC INPUT

**Board of Trade** 

- Vice-President of the Board of Trade (BoT)
- The BoT seeks to support the Town and had queries regarding several areas
  - a. <u>MEDC planning</u>: Mayor Bill MacDonald was able to share a broad overview of the existing strategic plan, noting that in the areas concerning MEDC, goals have been achieved.
  - b. <u>Town Wharf</u>: It was noted that the BoT supports waterfront development. Mayor MacDonald shared that the Wharf has recently come back under Town control, and that the Town would consider how best to utilize this asset for the benefit of all.
  - c. <u>Unesco World Heritage Site/Gardens in Bloom</u>: The BoT also sought to explore the possibility of the Town applying once again for world heritage status or the

Gardens in Bloom award. It was noted that the Town has won multiple awards of this nature. It was felt these kinds awards could be useful in attracting new residents.
