MAYOR'S MESSAGE



In February, Council struck a Task Team to recommend strategies and actions to adjust to, and over time, replace the anticipated loss of revenue as a result of the proposed retirement of the tidal power plant. The members of the team include CAO Sandi Millett-Campbell, Byron Mersereau, and your Mayor. To date, the Team has made a total of 11 recommendations to Council, all of which have been accepted. The following is a summary of those recommendations and a status report on the actions taken so far:



Mayor Amery Boyer, B. Mus., MBA

- Send letter to the Minister of Municipal Affairs requesting phase -out of the expected reduction in the NSPI grant in lieu: complete
- Economize on this year's budget while attending to priority projects: in progress
- Prioritize land development within the Town: the CAO has and does have this well in hand.
- 4. Update inventory of vacant lands: in progress
- Consider letter to Annapolis Valley Regional Library to deal with increase in costs since the move to the Academy: letter has been sent, holding for meeting with the various parties involved.
- 6. Consider "interested party" status with NSURB hearings In addition to the anticipated large reduction in the grant in lieu, the Town wants to ensure the proceedings and steps leading toward the retirement of the tidal power plant assets are handled in a manner that includes comprehensive environmental assessments and allows ample opportunity for full consideration of adapted or alternate uses for at least some of the assets. As well, existing and future uses of the tidal power plant property are subject to the Town's Municipal Planning Strategy, Land Use Bylaw, and an existing Development Agreement: complete, the Town has received confirmation of intervenor status from the UARB.
- 7. Consider all development/redevelopment options at the causeway: in progress; two options have been received by the Town to date.
- 8. Review existing and future land use and MPS requirements for the properties concerned: **not yet completed.**
- Request to NSPI regarding which decommissioning option it may be leaning towards: complete; At this time, NSPI appears to be leaning towards demolition of the plant. The Town's Intervenor status in the upcoming UARB Hearing allows for pursuit of more details on this and other matters.
- 10. Consider three-year operating budget plan: in progress
- 11. Consider partnering with Soluna Energy Inc. and collaborating on an application to the Canadian Federation of Municipalities for funding to test a community scale tidal power production project: if the application is successful, 80% of the cost of the project could be funded through Green Municipal Funds, and supplemental funding would be sought for the remainder: The Town and Soluna have begun preliminary work on the application. Assuming the project proves to be successful during the test period, it offers the potential to significantly increase Town's revenues.

If you have any questions on these or other initiatives, please feel free to contact CAO Millett-Campbell. NSPI's application to retire the tidal power plant was sent to the Nova Scotia Utility Review Board in February and a public hearing is scheduled to begin on September 13, 2021 in Halifax. Depending on the situation related to Covid-19, the public hearing may be held by Go-ToWebinar video conferencing.

Welcome back and welcome all! Visitors are invited to experience the infrastructure revitalization at Kejimkujik National Park and National Historic Site. Please follow all public health guidelines and restrictions while at Kejimkujik.

Jeremy's Bay Campground features 10 new inclusive washroom and shower facilities that are gender-neutral and accessible, with barrier-free design for improved privacy and personal security of diverse visitors. Facilities are connected to new and efficient water and wastewater treatment plants that provide visitors with safe and reliable water.


Jim Charles Point features five new Ôasis heated teardrop-shaped units with a table that converts into a bed and a suspended hammock loft above. Jim Charles Point also features the heated and newly insulated oTENTik Village, now with water views, and the heated and newly insulated rustic cabins that offer more privacy, now with mattresses! These new and improved roofed accommodations make shoulder-season stays cozier.

Hikers and mountain bikers alike will enjoy Kejimkujik's newest trail in decades! Ukme'k is a 6.3 km shared-use trail that connects the campground with popular day-use areas along the Mersey River. Mountain bikers will enjoy the intermediate-level challenges that Ukme'k offers, that beginners can easily bypass.



Visitors may notice a number of fallen hemlock trees at the campground. Parks Canada is using active management to respond to the invasive hemlock wooly adelgid pest. This includes restorative silviculture and planting saplings to help create a more resilient and diverse forest.

Parks Canada staff are ready to welcome you to all there is to offer at Kejimkujik! Visit reservation.pc.gc.ca to book. Consider booking during shoulder seasons (May 21 – June 21, and September 7 – October 30) or mid-week stays. Check back for site cancellations. Kejimkujik is operating under COVID-19 public health guidelines and restrictions, including physical distancing and wearing masks indoors. Check pc.gc.ca/keji before you arrive for up-todate information.

As the good weather is upon us and the sun is shining, the bicycles are coming back out. Please be sure to read below to ensure everyone enjoys this beautiful bike-riding time of year

Cyclists

All cyclists must observe the rules of the road.

Cyclists need the ability to handle themselves in various situations, adhere to traffic regulations, and share the road with motor vehicles. Whether you are resident or a visitor, we hope that you have a safe fun cycling experience.

To do so, please follow these basic rules:

- Wear a helmet it's the law.
- Be visible, wear bright colors.
- Be alert.
- Be predictable.
- Know the rules of the road and follow them.
- Ride on the right-hand side of the road in the same direction as traffic.
- Ride in single file.
- Make sure your bike is in good working order.
- Use a bicycle bell or horn.
- Use a front white light and a red rear reflective while riding at night. At a minimum, reflective clothing is recommended.
- Always be courteous to pedestrians and mind your speed in areas with people walking around.

Motorists

- Cyclists have the same right as motorists in Nova Scotia.
- Pass cyclists safely, at least one meter away- it's the law.
- Watch for cyclists and be careful.
- Slow down a drive within posted speed limits.
- Do not pass and cut off cyclists. They are travelling faster than you think.
- Look before you open the door.

Did you know that Nova Scotia was the first Province in Canada to enact amendments to the Provincial Motor vehicle Act to create the one meter rule. Bill 93, June 2011.

Frauds and Scams

Regardless of their age, gender, ethnicity, race and/or marital status, confidence ('con') artists share a few things in common. They all offer deals to help you out, get you something you need for 'half price' or even make you rich. All are linked by a common knowledge of human nature and are adept at exploiting it to their advantage.

Part 1 Home Improvement:

One of the most prolific schemes is the door-to-door renovating company. These salespeople claim that they "just happen to be in the neighborhood" and offer a good deal for improvements you might want done.

Don't feel pressured. Ask questions and only commit to the business when you are satisfied that he/she is legitimately representing a reputable company and that you actually need the work done. Always be skeptical of salespeople who offer to inspect your roof, chimney, or furnace at no cost. You can be sure they will recommend work that is required immediately, whether or not it actually is.

The safest way to ensure satisfaction is to get estimates from established companies in your community. Because these firms have reputations and businesses to protect and will be around after the work is done, you can expect a higher quality of workmanship and a better price.

Updated Invasive Species Policy

The Environment Advisory Committee has been diligently working on an amended Invasive Species Policy to reflect new procedures and resources. Council approved the updated policy on April 19, 2021 (MOTION #C2021-04-19-08) and the policy came in effect on April 22, 2021. Triton Criminal Record Checks

The new Triton online criminal record checks are aimed at providing those who are required to complete one the ease of doing so at home or at work without the need to complete a paper form.

This service can be completed using any computer, tablet, or smartphone.

The check is completed by clicking on the link provided by our police agency or on the town website:

- 1. Complete the type of check you want employment or volunteer.
- 2. Fill out the required fields as requested.
- 3. Verify your identity by answering questions that will appear on the screen that are personal to you.
- 4. If you answer everything correctly, you will be asked to pay and your request will be sent to be completed by the Police Service.
- 5. Once completed by the Police Service, you will receive an email with your criminal record check.

Please note if you require a vulnerable sector check, only those who live in the Town of Annapolis Royal can have this service completed online. Anyone outside the town must go to the Police agency of their jurisdiction for this.

The aim for this service is to hopefully complete the request within 24 to 48 hours upon submission. (Please note during statutory holidays or weekends this may take longer.)

The cost for a criminal record check with this new service will be \$38.95. The price also includes a service fee by the third party platform provider which covers the use of the online system. Volunteers who are residents of Town of Annapolis Royal can get a criminal record check for only a \$8.95 fee. This service is anticipated to start within the next few weeks, stay tuned to hear more!

Downtown Parking

Accessibility in Annapolis Royal

"In 2017 Nova Scotia passed the Act Respecting Accessibility in Nova Scotia. The Accessibility Act aims to make Nova Scotia inclusive and barrier-free by 2030"- www.accessibilitycanada.ca

Did you know that 30% of Nova Scotians aged 15 and older have at least one disability? Accessibility is a human right and includes access to goods and services, information and communication, transportation, employment, education, built environment. The Nova Scotia Accessibility Act was put in place to guarantee these rights and establish a process for helping ensure our communities become open to all.

As a first step, the Town has established its Accessibility Advisory Committee. The Committee will draft a plan for the Town to reach its accessibility goals. Beginning with municipal services, polices, and buildings, the committee will assess how inclusive we are currently, and how best to meet the established targets. On May 31st, the Committee will start by looking at the accessibility of our municipal buildings, sidewalks, crosswalks. A historic Town such as Annapolis Royal presents some unique challenges but does not lessen our responsibility. The Committee will spend the next year drafting our community plan, which will then be shared, improved, and ultimately adopted, providing a path forward.
