MAYOR'S MESSAGE

On behalf of Town Council and the staff, I would like to extend our appreciation for all of your water conservation efforts and your patience over a very difficult period that began on June 29th just before Canada Day and ended just last week. This was an especially difficult time for our local businesses which have borne the brunt of the ever evolving COVID-19 restrictions. Thanks to all of you who were determined to shop local no matter what. I would also like to take this opportunity on behalf of Town Council to thank the Town staff, our Public Works Department, the Annapolis Royal and Bear River Volunteer Fire Departments, and all departments for the focused and effective management of yet another state of emergency during tourism season.

Some good news in the grants department. Our Recreation Director was successful in securing just over \$23,000 for automatic door operators and office accessibility upgrades like the widening of doors and lowering of the administration office window at Town Hall. This helps the Town to meet the requirements of the Accessibility Act. The Town was also successful in securing \$25,000 from Clean Foundation to go towards the cost of securing a qualified intern to assist the Town and the Environment Committee in the development of our climate change plan. This will also help us to comply with the requirements of the Nova Scotia Coastal Protection Act and pending regulations.

In the meantime, the municipal units in Kings and Annapolis counties have been meeting regularly to develop better language for inter-municipal agreements as a tool for more and better collaboration between our towns and counties. Our CAOs have been meeting to work on proposals for consideration by our respective councils which the public will be able to review in upcoming meetings. The Town's participation in this effort is consistent with one of the strategies outlined our new strategic plan, increased reliance on collaboration as a means of containing expenses by working with our neighbours to get things done.

Beyond Oqwa'titek Events

The Nova Scotia Day weekend (September 10-12), where we will mark the inaugural Beyond Oqwa'titek event, is fast approaching. Previously, the event's website and our virtual roundtable highlighted some of the larger themes the event is recognizing, but you may be wondering what the weekend itself will hold.

The weekend will begin on Friday with the KAIROS Blanket Exercise, a "kinesthetic learning experience which involves participants walking on blankets while an indigenous narrator and role-playing Europeans conduct a story to learn about 500+ years of indigenous histories". This powerful exercise addresses the colonial viewpoint and helps others see things from an indigenous point of view. At Fort Anne, a series of short indigenous films will also be featured. Saturday will feature Pow Wow performers, highland dancers, and storytellers all before the official opening ceremony at Fort Anne. There will also be an event highlighting the Gaelic experience and the evening will end with a Ceilidh at Market Square. The big

events on Sunday will be a Kirkin' O' the Tartan, a Procession of Remembrance, and a special Mapannapolis event. The day will end with a multicultural closing ceremony.

These are just the highlights. It promises to be an engaging weekend which celebrates the Mi'kmaq and Scottish cultures.

We hope to see you there.

Frauds and Scams continued

Internet Over-Payment Fraud:

In this type of fraud, a seller posts an item(s) for sale on the Internet. A buyer contacts the seller and arrangements are made to purchase the product. The buyer then sends the seller a cashier's cheque or money order for an amount greater than the price of the merchandise.

From here, the buyer directs the seller to cash the cheque and wire the excess funds to either the buyer or a third party. The seller, believing the cheque to be genuine, deposits the cheque and then wires the amount of the overpayment as directed.

It is usually after the funds have been wired that the cashier's cheque or money order is returned as counterfeit. The bank then holds the seller responsible for the amount of the fraudulent cheque, leaving the seller defrauded of both the money and the product.

The following guidelines are offered by the Springfield Police Service to assist sellers in minimizing their risk of Internet over-payment fraud:

- Be suspicious if the cheque you receive is greater than the agreed upon price of the merchandise you are selling. You may wish to consider an online payment service.
- Current technology has improved the quality of counterfeit cheques and therefore makes them difficult to detect. Be wary if the cheque is drawn from an out-of-country bank account as it may take a month before the counterfeit is realized.
- Never agree to accept a cheque for an inflated amount and to reimburse the balance.
- Never agree to wire bank funds to the buyer or forward the funds to a third party. The buyer will have several seemingly legitimate reasons for wanting this done but all should be met with skepticism. The buyer may even offer an incentive to compensate you for your trouble by allowing you to keep an additional portion of the cheque as a tip.
- Know who you are dealing with when conducting transactions over the Internet and confirm the personal information of the buyer.
- Do not succumb to any pressure at the hands of the buyer or feel you have to complete a transaction when you are not comfortable. As much as you may be tempted to make the sale, you will regret not taking the time at the beginning to ensure you are dealing with a legitimate purchaser.
- The jeopardy with this kind of scam is that by depositing the fraudulent cheque into your bank account you have, in essence, become an unwitting party to the offence and could be held liable by your bank and/or face criminal prosecution.

Lottery Scams:

The primary thing to say to yourself when contacted by someone who tells you that you are the big winner or have the chance of a lifetime is: If it sounds too good to be true, chances are, it is. If you have legitimately won a lottery, you will never have to pay anything to receive your windfall. Be very cautious when being told you have won a contest you cannot recall entering. Your name may be on a list that has been sold.

How Criminals Get Your Information:

Criminals have many sources. They might steal your wallet or personal documents left in your vehicle. They might also steal from mailboxes and rifle through recycling bins. Some companies have been known to make a profit by selling your information (address, name, phone number, etc.). Criminals have been known to use false names to avoid capture by the authorities. Often, by the time someone realizes they have been a victim of fraud, the criminals have already moved on to another identity or con, making them even more difficult to track.



Town Crier Available Online

In light of the goals of our strategic plan (regarding efficient operations, conserving resources, and climate change) that was approved in June, a review of the processes related to the production and distribution of the Town Crier was undertaken. Starting in September, the Town Crier newsletter will not be sent via mail. It will be made available online and through email via Mail Chimp. This change will help achieve the Town's strategic goals related to efficient use of staff time and streamlined operations as well as those related to climate change due to a more responsible use of resources.

Water Emergency in Annapolis Royal

As you are aware, our Town suffered a water emergency with a boil water advisory that lasted roughly four weeks. This was due to the water tank failure in Granville Ferry. The County's repairs to the initial infrastructure failure were unsuccessful and subsequently created a larger problem that hindered the repair time. The Town of Annapolis Royal needed to outsource water for the customers of the water utility from neighboring municipalities during this timeframe which cost the Town nearly \$165,000.

On Friday, July 23rd, the repairs were completed to the Granville Ferry water tank, the boil water advisory was lifted, and the Annapolis Royal Water Utility returned back on the County water system. It was great working with the County of Annapolis and having ongoing communication throughout the past four weeks. On behalf of Town Council and staff, we would like to express our sincerest thank you to everyone for all the effort of conserving water and support through the water emergency. Another huge thank you goes to our local Annapolis Royal Volunteer Fire Department and Bear River Fire Department for their ongoing assistance. It was due to the strength and resilience of everyone in our community that we were able to get through this crisis and we are exceptionally happy to move forward.

Task Team Members Needed

As you read in last month's issue, the Town is now implementing Task Teams. These teams can be formed quickly with specific terms of reference to deal with the projects, and then disbanded once the objectives are met. This allows committees to use the expert knowledge in the community without asking for a long commitment. If using your experience to help the Town improve, without signing on for a long-term commitment sounds good, this may be for you.

Your first opportunities are here. The Marketing and Economic Development Committee is forming two Task Teams. The first is looking at potential (appropriate) development opportunities for First Lake. The second will look at developing similar opportunities for the waterfront. Downtown Parking



Facilities Use & Agreements Policy

Just a friendly reminder that the amended Facilities Use & Agreements policy will charge \$10/hour for non-profit organizations for use of Town facilities. Council agreed that this will only be for a pilot term starting in September 2021 and reassessed in May 2022. With the fate of the Tidal Power Plant being unknown, the increase/addition of charging a Not-For Profit rate for space rental is essential to generate income from these spaces. 
