

## WHAT'S UP ANNAPOLIS?





The Town of Annapolis Royal has designated June 18th to be the Journée Pierre Dugua de Mons Day.

The inauguration and the unveiling of a new bilingual interpretive panel, funded by The Historical Association of Annapolis Royal, will take place in a community ceremony at the Oqwa'titek Amphitheatre at 2 pm on Sunday, June 18th.

You are invited to attend this ceremony where you will be entertained by Acadian dancers from La Baie en Joie troupe from Clare and will be able to meet the members of the delegation from our twinned city of Royan, France, the birthplace of Dugua de Mons. Mayor Patrick Marengo and his delegation will be visiting Annapolis Royal for the very first time.

You will also have the opportunity to meet the delegation when Acadian music duo Madouesse play at the Oqwa'titek on Friday, June 16th at 6 pm and then again to speak with Mayor Marengo at Market Square along with Warden Morrison and Mayor Boyer on Saturday, June 17th at 10 am.

Pierre Dugua, sieur de Mons, (1560-1628) in establishing the Habitation at Port-Royal in 1605, is recognised as playing a major role in the first successful site of French presence in North America. Thanks to the friendship of Grand Chief Membertou and the Mi'kmaq people, the settlement survived and developed. Although the English burned the Habitation to the ground in 1613, French presence here in Acadie would continue to grow.

We hope you will join the Annapolis Royal Twinning Committee in welcoming our visitors and participating in this event.

#### Twinning Highlights

This summer, the Annapolis Royal Twinning Committee will be hosting an 11-person delegation from our Twin City, Royan, France which arrives on the evening of June 15 at Halifax airport. The events for that weekend include a welcome breakfast on June 16 and a visit to Bear River First Nation. On Saturday, June 17, there will be a "meet and Greet" event at the Farmers' Market at 10:00 am with the Mayor of Royan, Warden Peter Morrison and your mayor, followed by a wine and cheese event at the Habitation sponsored by the French Consul-general, and an official dinner later that evening. On June 18, the public is invited to the inauguration of the new Pierre Dugua de Mons plaque at the amphitheatre at 2:00 pm. The event will feature Acadian dancers and special presentations. The Lieutenant Governor will also be in attendance. On Monday, June 19, the Société acadienne de Clare will host both Royan's and the Town's twinning committees, with the French delegation heading to Grand Pré and the airport on June 20. Hats off to Christine Igot and the Annapolis Royal twinning team for all of the planning and work that has gone into making this a landmark event for our town this year!

#### Congratulations Annapolis Royal Refresh!

Thanks to representatives of the Farmers' and Traders' Market, the Annapolis Board of Trade, AIRO and Town staff, a collaborative project is underway to introduce new elements and new activities to the wharf and market square this summer. A very successful community input session was held on May 11, with a diverse group of people in attendance who offered various suggestions and comments on how the two areas could be improved and enhanced to

#### **CHIEFS CORNER**

#### **Burglary Prevention**

If burglars are certain that no one is at home, they will feel safer committing a crime. Would-be burglars often canvass neighbourhoods looking for uncut lawns and stuffed mailboxes. They spend spare evenings in search of darkened houses or lights that have been left on too long. To reduce the possibility of burglary, the Annapolis Royal Police Service recommends the following series of tips:

#### At Home or Work:

- → Keep a record of serial numbers and descriptions of your household possessions.
- → Inscribe your possessions with your name or other easily identifiable marking so that the police can confirm them as yours and return them to you.
- → Install secure locks in your home.
- → Use the locks you already have.
- → Do not leave notes on your door.
- → Change locks if keys have been lost or stolen.
- → Doors should have sturdy frames, with hinges that cannot be removed.
- → When moving into a new house or apartment, change all the locks.
- → Always lock your garage.
- → Secure your gas barbecue with a chain and padlock.

High value items such as lawn mowers, snow blowers, and gas barbecues should be stored out of sight when not in use. Garden sheds and cabanas should also be locked.

## TOWN HALL... STAY CONNECTED



#### Notes, Notices and Updates from Town Hall

→ The Outdoor Fire and Orderly and Peaceful Conduct By-laws have passed and adopted

- → Paul Wear is acclaimed to the role of Councillor and will be sworn in at the June 7 Committee of the Whole meeting
  - → Council approved the purchase of a new blower, and repair of the old blower (as a back up) for the sewer system
  - → Council pre-approved the Scada system for the water system
- → There will be a public meeting for the Municipal Planning Strategy amendment regarding the new provincial minimum planning requirements on June 6 at 9:00 am.
- → Council approved two low-income tax exemptions and eight non-profit tax reductions
- → Council nominated Jeff Hafting for the Provincial Volunteer Awards
- → Council approved application to Provincial Capital Assistance and Community Works Programs for funding needed projects
- → Council approved that the Town enter into an agreement with the property owner regarding the walkway from the parking lot to St George Street by the Artelli building
- → Council approved four applications for heritage renovations
- → Council agreed that the Fire Society Agreement be signed. This is the first approved and signed agreement since 1955!


#### Physical Activity, Sedentary Behaviour, and Sleep (PASS): a new way of tracking healthy daily activity

- → Only 22.2% of Canadian adults get the recommended amount of weekly physical activity.
- → On average, Canadian adults spend 9.8 hours of their daily waking hours being sedentary.
- → Canadians adults get an average of 7.1 hours of sleep each night.
- → 21.5% of Canadian adults report walking or cycling to work/school at least occasionally.
- → In 1992, 45% of Canadians 15 and older participated in sports. In 2010, that participation rate had dropped to 26%.
- → Canadian adults report that they accumulate 23.6 hours of screen-time each week during leisure time. Activities like watching television or videos, spending time on the computer and playing video games are considered 'screen-time'. [Physical Activity Guidelines]
- → 78% of Canadians report free or low-cost recreation facilities in their neighbourhood.

## IN OTHER NEWS



#### **Improving Access to Primary Care**

Nova Scotians deserve access to healthcare when and where they need it. Whether you're attached to a primary care provider or not, access has been a challenge for too many. Over the past decade not enough was done to recruit for doctor retirements or plan for population growth.

Many Nova Scotians are attached to a family care provider but can't easily get an appointment. Others have access through virtual care, primary care clinics, mobile clinics or at their local pharmacy – but may want to be attached to a consistent provider who can follow their care.

Our government is working to improve both access and attachment so Nova Scotians get the care they need the way they want to receive it.

Recently, we announced plans for more than 60 new and strengthened clinics, including collaborative family practice teams, primary care clinics and urgent treatment centres across the province.

What does that mean for you? As clinics open, patients who might have had to go to an emergency department or wait weeks to see a provider will get better care, faster.

Expanding options and team-based clinics will help get Nova Scotians off the Need a Family Practice Registry and boost options for same-day/next-day appointments. It will also mean more healthcare providers will get the support they need. This is just one of many actions we're taking to improve primary care.

There are now 26 pharmacy clinics offering appointments for patients with common illnesses or who take medications for chronic diseases. There are also several pharmacy walk-in clinics and ALL pharmacies can renew prescriptions.

VirtualCareNS is free for everyone on the Need a Family Practice Registry. If an in-person visit is needed, people will be seen at a primary care clinic. Mobile clinics are also travelling the province. We're also recruiting nationally and internationally. More than 160 new doctors started practising in Nova Scotia between April 2022 and March 2023. After factoring in retirements, there are now 86 more family and specialty physicians in the system than there were last year.

We're changing how healthcare is delivered to help Nova Scotians get the care they need, faster. We will do what it takes to fix the system because when we invest in healthcare, we invest in Nova Scotia's future.
