

In 2018, Annapolis Royal Pride began as a small community event and walk in the town. These initial events were important in creating a sense of belonging and visibility for the local LGBTQ+ community and lead to a great documentary called Small Town Pride – you can check it out at http://smalltownpridedoc.com/.

In 2021 Annapolis Royal Pride experienced significant growth and transformation becoming a three day community festival that embraced inclusion, acceptance, and diversity, showcased local talent and provided a platform for individuals of all backgrounds and identities to express themselves freely in a safe community environment. The festival acts as a beacon of inclusion and diversity, attracting individuals and families who may have previously felt marginalized or excluded. By fostering an environment that celebrates differences, Annapolis Royal Pride festival sends a powerful message of acceptance and unity. This sense of belonging has a profound effect on local queer youth, families, and all community members at large.

For queer youth in the region, the festival serves as an important source of inspiration and validation. It is a safe and welcoming space to gain a sense of hope for their own futures. It further helps to combat feelings of isolation, discrimination and fear too many queer youth so often face.

Annapolis Royal Pride also helps promote education and awareness within the broader community by highlighting local talent, hosting various activities, events, and discussions, and developing community partnerships. It also partners and promotes 2SLGBTQI+ health initiatives and programs. These activities create opportunities for dialogue and understanding which in turn increases awareness, fosters empathy, and encourages the dismantling of stereotypes and long held prejudices.

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

News and Updates

On June 27, members of the Twinning Committee met to debrief on the twinning activities and events that took place between June 15 to 20, revenues and costs, and to discuss the possibilities for the future. Feedback on the public events that were held has been very positive. A full report is in progress.

The Town will soon be issuing a request for expressions of interest for a third-party feasibility study for the smallscale community tidal power pilot project we have been working on for the last several years. Funding support for

the study is available from several sources and there are a few consulting firms which would be able to carry out the work. The study is required in order to support testing of the technology in a real-world environment. If this project is successful, it could lead to the establishment of an electrical utility owned and operated by the Town in partnership with other municipal units and one or more private and not for profit organizations.

The Atlantic Infrastructure Network (AIM) is still working on its report on sea level rise for the Town. Outstanding items include what to do about the wharf and the approaches that have been suggested so far, access to the boat haul-up, sea wall design including aesthetics, and the costs of building a sea wall. A second public meeting will be scheduled once the next draft report is received.

Have you planned what you would like to do on Canada Day this year? Annapolis Royal Flood Protection

In March the Town held a public consultation on concept plans for new waterfront protection for flood risk in our Town. We have known for some time that flood risks are real for our downtown area currently, and that climate change will increase the likelihood and potential impacts of flooding. We now have a conceptual layout of the waterfront renewal, and will be seeking funding next year for detailed design and construction through the Federation of Canadian Municipalities Green Municipal Fund and the federal Disaster Mitigation and Adaptation Fund. With the release of the National Adaptation Strategy and Canada's focus on building resilient communities, we can build a new vision for our vibrant community, one that protects our residents for the future while retaining the character of our past.



We have identified a future-adaptive strategy to minimize current costs and impacts to the waterfront. Climate predictions have uncertainty, and our proposed length and height of wall are based on the best-case scenarios to 2100 and the worst-case scenarios to 2050. The structure will be built so that it can be extended without rebuilding in 20 to 30 years if we find ourselves facing the worst-case of sea-level rise. The Town adopted this strategy to avoid over-building, to reduce the cost impact on the Town and its residents and to minimize the visual effect on the waterfront.

So what's next? You will see some drilling equipment on the shoreline this summer collecting information about the soils under the existing boardwalk and trails to help with the upcoming detail design. Joy Elliot, a local land-

scape architect known to many is going to be putting some ideas together for the look and feel of the new elevated boardwalk and trail system. The initial report is currently being updated to reflect the staged construction and to develop new cost estimates for the funding applications. We are continuing discussions with Nova Scotia Power and Department of Natural Resources on how the former tidal plant causeway can be managed as part of our flood protection strategy. We will also be reaching out to our neighbors at Bear River First Nation to begin the consultation process. You can expect another public session in the fall to let you know where we stand, and we look forward at seeing another great community turnout!

Emergency Line: 911

- → Whether you go away for a day or week, use automatic timers that turn lights on and off to give your home the appearance of being occupied.
- → Leave your travel schedule and phone number with a trusted neighbour or relative so that you may be contacted if necessary.
- → Also provide that neighbour with the phone number of a close relative or friend in case of emergency
- \rightarrow Leave a door key and key to your alarm system (if you have one) with a neighbour
- → Let close neighbours know how long you will be gone and provide details about any person who will be visiting your home during your absence.
- \rightarrow Have a neighbour pick up newspapers and mail or discontinue all deliveries.
- \rightarrow Arrange to have your lawn mowed or snow shovelled
- → If you have a second car, leave it in your driveway or arrange to have a neighbour park their car in your driveway.
- \rightarrow Check all windows and doors to make sure that they are locked.
- \rightarrow Lock your garage.
- → Check with your insurance agent regarding home checks while your residence is unoccupied. You may not be covered if your home has not been visited while you are away on vacation.

Federal Carbon Tax Unacceptable

On July 1, Nova Scotians will wake up to increases in the cost of gasoline, diesel, and other everyday goods.

The Government of Canada, led by Prime Minster Justin Trudeau, is imposing a carbon tax in Nova Scotia and across Atlantic Canada. This is despite our government having a better, common-sense approach to fighting climate change that doesn't punish Nova Scotians, especially those living in rural areas.

Increases in gas may be acceptable in some large cities across the country, but a 14 cent per litre increase in gas is just not fair for a family living, working, and attending school outside of a major city centre - where they don't have the options of public transportation or bike lanes

We agree with the federal government's goal - to reduce carbon emissions across the country. We need to address the climate emergency. But we couldn't be further apart on how to achieve it.

IN OTHER NEWS

Nova Scotia is a leader in reducing greenhouse gas emissions. We have the second-highest reductions in the country. And we already pay some of the highest rates for energy.

We have a realistic plan that is better than the federal carbon tax. It includes some of the most ambitious 2030 targets in the country and policies and programs to meet them.

Part of that plan includes developing opportunities in clean, renewable energy, like solar, wind and green hydrogen to make your homes more energy efficient and save you money.

Nova Scotia's plan creates good-paying jobs, helps reduce energy bills and makes our economy stronger, without costing Nova Scotians more at the pumps. We set benchmarks to hold us accountable and asked the federal government to give us time to prove we will meet our goals.

Instead, the federal government is imposing a carbon tax that will make life more unaffordable.

Nova Scotians should be proud of the work they have done to fight climate change work we've been doing for years without a carbon tax. We are leaders in Canada with a record of success.

My government remains firmly opposed to the federal government's carbon tax plans to start on Canada Day. We do not need the federal carbon tax on the gas, diesel and home heating fuels you currently depend on.

We ask all Nova Scotians to join us by speaking to your Member of Parliament and sending a message to the Government of Canada.
