iii. Update on Atlantic Infrastructure Management Network Conference Mayor Boyer and CAO Millett-Cambell were invited to attend this conference and were asked to present two items: Strategic Planning for Small Communities and Accessing Money from Non-Traditional Sources. Atlantic Infrastructure Management Network is working on the Capital Asset Plan for the Town of Annapolis, and Mayor Boyer stated that the goal is for the Town to develop integrated plans so that it can be proactive in addressing the piece(s) of infrastructure that will go next. During this conference, they made contact with representatives from two towns with electrical utilities and discussed the possibility of partnerships for the Town's small scale community tidal power pilot project.

On a related note, the Nova Scotia Community College (NSCC) is planning to write a proposal for the Town for a feasibility study for a project which will involve some testing of the turbines. The proposal should be available by October $6^{\rm th}$.
