#### STUDENT PROJECT—ANNAPOLIS ROYAL ANS HISTORY



#### Nova Scotia Wildfire Season March 15 - October 15

The risk of wildfires is highest during the dry season (March 15 to October 15) when the earth and forests lack moisture. Although you may not be able to eliminate the risk of wildfire you can take measures to protect your home and property.

#### Check before you burn

During the wildfire risk season (March 15 to October 15) all domestic brush burning and campfires must adhere to daily Nova Scotia burning restrictions. Each day at 2:00PM the burning restrictions are posted on novascotia.ca/burnsafe/

# **Domestic brush** burning and campfires

Restrictions apply March 15 to October 15

No burning between 8am and 2pm Restrictions are set at 2pm daily

Save your brush over summer to burn in winter when wildfire risk is low.

#### Theft Prevention (Vehicles Part 1)

#### **Invest in Vehicle Protection:**

As an added deterrent to would-be auto thieves, you may wish to consider purchasing an anti-theft device(s) such as:

Ignition Kill Switch: Toggle switch spliced into a vehicle's ignition that disables it. Only the key enables the vehicle to start.

Fuel Kill Switch: Switch spliced into a vehicle's fuel system wiring that stops fuel supply to the engine

Steering Wheel Lock: Prevents a steering wheel from turning

Gearshift Lock: Disables shifting transmission

Hood Lock: Stops anyone from opening a vehicle's hood

Steering Column Collar: Protects a vehicle's steering column from ignition entry

Electronic Alarm: Those with "kill" switches are most effective

Vehicle Tracking System: Transmitter located in a vehicle that enables its location to be traced electronically

#### Record The Following In A Safe Place:

- Year, make, model and colour of your vehicle
- Licence and vehicle identification numbers
- Serial numbers of any special equipment

Any dents or scratches that distinguish your vehicle from others

#### If Your Vehicle Is Stolen:

Report it immediately to the police

Provide police with identification or specific information about the vehicle and any valuables contained therein

#### We Don't want to be Grouches, but Please Respect Our Garbage Cans

Throughout the Town you will find municipal garbage cans, many with free dog waste dispensers. These cans are intended for the use of passers-by so that small items can be deposited, with the intent of keeping our Town cleaner. Spring through Fall, Public Works empties these cans as needed so that that a handy receptacle is always available for use.

Increasingly, we are finding household waste in the municipal cans. Occasionally, whole bags of garbage are placed on top of the cans (because the bags will not fit through the small holes), but generally we find multiple household items (laundry detergent containers, full vacuum bags, even vacuum cleaners) quickly filling these cans, leaving them unavailable for others. This leads to garbage ending up on the ground around these cans.

Please limit your use of these cans to appropriate items. We are not asking anyone to be garbage police. If Public Works finds identifying household waste (we have even found bills) it is reported to by-law enforcement so that a citation may be issued. We are simply asking everyone to simply limit their use of the garbage cans to necessary items so that the cans remain available to all. Thank you for your help.
