to deliver this signature event and some volunteers will be moving on to other things, so we all need to think about how we can contribute to making it happen again next year. One of the legacies of the 2024 organising team was the development of a comprehensive Natal Day weekend template and tracking system that made meetings very focused and effective.

Upcoming Municipal Elections

The importance of municipal elections is underestimated by most people. We tend to think that municipal government is a given, that it will operate without us doing much of anything about it. This year, in addition to voting, you are invited to consider whether or not this is the time for you or someone you know to offer for Mayor or Councillor. The attributes required are spelled out in the Town's Code of Conduct which includes the requirement for objectivity and putting the collective interests of the Town before all other interests. The Town also does its best to make decisions based on facts, empowering staff and people through by-laws, policies and committee structure, integrating efforts, and continuous improvement. The information you need can be found on the Town Website https://annapolisroyal.com/municipal-elections/ or by visiting Town Hall. Melony Robinson is the Returning Officer and Donna Neath is the Assistant Returning Officer. These are the people who are responsible for administering the election on The Town's behalf. Nomination day is September 10th, but anyone can put their name forward seven business days prior to that date.

Annapolis County Inter-Municipal Working Group

After a successful first year, the Municipality of the County of Annapolis and the towns of Middleton and Annapolis Royal have decided to extend this working group for another year. The group meets once a month to work on a preset and focused agenda. Every meeting brings different topics which in the past year have ranged from climate change and emergency services, to policing, fire protection, planning, economic development, recreation and other things. In between meetings, the CAOs of the three units get together to work on follow up actions coming out of the larger groups as well as preparation of future agendas. The results so far include better information sharing and coordination, joint applications for funding, and success in attracting staff and funding for joint projects. There is great potential from this group for future joint projects. On behalf of the Group, I would like to express our appreciation for the very important contribution to this whole process by the three Annapolis County CAOs. Their work continues to inform every meeting of the Working Group.

<u>Grant Potter Memorial Park and Playground Revitalization</u> <u>Update - Summer 2024</u>

Great news regarding the playground revitalization project. After a year and a half of fundraising and grant applications, the project is now moving forward based on the funds received with construction set to begin in mid September 2024! This will include the installation of a new hill slide, swing set, spiral climbing carousel, path excavation and repair, drainage, seating, and impact surfacing. All redesigned elements feature features and elements that consider accessibility, safety, and inclusion. The newly revitalized park will truly have something for everyone.

Along with the Federal Accessibility funding for \$59,000 received in the early spring of 2024, we have received an additional grant from the Province of Nova Scotia Dept. of Communities, Culture, Tourism & Heritage for \$50,000! This total along with local fundraising, commitment from Town Council, and Public Works' time and talents gets us very close to our goal. We are still fundraising to complete an additional feature that is a small boat for younger kids that includes a fun play space with sensory activities, chalkboard, and games, as well as some miscellaneous fun features for the park like a kit of loose parts and a toddler/infantspecific swing.

SEASONAL

Swimming

Pool and Hot Tub Safety

- Never swim alone
- Swim in areas that are supervised by lifeguards
- Never swim at night
- Know your limits. Always swim parallel to shore.
- Never dive into unknown waters. Watch for hazards below the surface.
- Obey warning signs about unsafe conditions such as undertows and/or pollution
- Avoid consuming alcohol before swimming

Be aware that swimming in cold water for extended periods of time may cause hypothermia, even during the summer months

Power Boating and Sailing

- Do not use an engine that is too powerful for your boat
- Obey speed limits. The top speed of all vessels within 30 metres (100 feet) of shore is 10 km/h or 6 mph.
- Personal floatation devices (PFDs) and/or approved lifejackets are required for each person travelling on a boat
- Depending on your boat's size and/or equipment, other safety devices may be required. Contact your nearest police service or the Canadian Coast Guard for information on your boat's needs.
- Always exercise caution when boarding and disembarking docked boats. Small boats are particulary susceptible to tipping.
- Be sure to distribute weight evenly in the boat and remain seated while it is in motion. Do not sit on the bow or gunwales (sides).
- Avoid overloading your boat with passengers and/or cargo
- Always check weather reports prior to heading out and be aware of changing weather patterns while on the water

Sail only in familiar waters. Use charts for unfamiliar areas.



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


