### 10. Unfinished Business

i. Public Engagement Suggestions/Meeting - Update Climate Lead Walker advised that this meeting was originally scheduled for September 19, 2024, and will need to move to the following week due to Town Election meetings, and they are waiting for confirmation of the new date. # ii. Nova Scotia Coastal Plan – Terms of Reference Levi Cliché is concerned about their capacity to lead this item, and there is an option to offer someone from Clean Annapolis River Project (CARP) whose position has been extended to March 2025. They were not sure if their suggestion is comfortable leading this committee, but have checked and they are happy to be on this committee and provide support. Levi Cliché added that they have been advised that the province is putting some mock-up by-laws for coastal management, and not sure of their timeline and should be on EAC's radar. In the meantime, can ask the person to take on the work that needs to be done in October. Levi Cliché added there might be the possibility of joining forces with other organizations regarding funds/grants being available.

Climate Lead Walker added that there are Municipal Climate Resiliency Grants available and will share the link.

Levi Cliché added that it would be a good idea to have scheduled meetings once this committee has been set up and there is always the option of adding additional meetings as needed.
