Each year, the Gulf of Maine Council (which includes Maine, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia) recognizes a community, or group within a community, for exemplary work in achieving sustainability outcomes related to the environment and economy, that are in line with the objectives of the Council's Action Plan. Thanks to a nomination by Steve Hawboldt, the **Town of Annapolis Royal received the Sustainable Communities Award in St Andrews in New Brunswick on May 27.**

This is an excerpt from my brief acceptance speech:

“The credit really belongs to all of the town councils going back to at least the late 70s and early 80s. The glory days of the Age of Sail were long past and members of Council and the business community got together to come up with a plan to save a historic but declining town. Together, they embarked on the biggest recycling project possible, the recycling of the many historic buildings in the town



including a theatre. Because the Town was so poor, it had escaped the house renovations of the 60s and 70s, including the vinyl and linoleum that came with it. As a result, the Town now has the largest concentration of heritage buildings per capita in Canada. Successive councils and staff have followed up on a legacy of built heritage by turning their attention to the environment and from 1998 to the present, on the impacts of climate change. Projects completed to date include engineered wetlands, a tertiary wastewater system with solar powered UV lights, installation of EV recharging stations, a living shoreline project and large tree canopy restoration.”

Steve Hawboldt is one of the people who has worked hard to provide sound environmental advice to councils over the years, and the Town continues to work with the Clean Annapolis River Foundation on environmental projects.

Hats off to Parks Canada for hosting an excellent celebration of the **300th Anniversary of the signing of the 1726 Peace and Friendship Treaty** with the Mi'kmaq people on June 4. The event was organized by the Mi'kmaq Grand Council Sante' Mawi'omi and the Government of Canada to honour the living treaties. It brought together Mi'kmaq leadership, Elders, and youth in full regalia, as well as members of the community, who turned out in large numbers. CHIEF'S CORNER

On June 22, 2026 the Annapolis Royal Police Service welcomed Elizabeth (Liz) Montgomery as the new Chief of Police. Liz Montgomery was born and raised in the Annapolis Valley.

She is a seasoned investigator, spanning 30 years of law enforcement experience, with over 10 years specializing in sexual assault investigations, child exploitation, threat and risk assessment, and high-risk offender management. As the lead of the threat assessment section, the majority of Liz's casework related to assessing and analyzing threat and risk in intimate partner and gender-based violence investigations.

She is qualified in advanced threat assessment for intimate partner violence, stalking, general violence, sexual violence, and school threat assessment. Liz was recognized for her exceptional investigative skills by the Ambassador of the United States and the Department of Homeland Security for linking a high-profile child exploitation case to a known sexual offender, who was subsequently brought to justice and convicted. Liz was also very involved with the Mass Casualty Commission serving as the Team Lead, Investigations.

ACCEPTED

***Limit of two items per bi-weekly collection.**

HOUSEHOLD APPLIANCES
Such as a washer, dryer, or stove.
NOTE: Cooling devices such as fridges, freezers, air conditioners, water coolers, and dehumidifiers must be brought to our sites for CFC removal or display a certified CFC removal sticker.

FURNITURE ITEMS
Such as a sofa, mattress, shelving. Any one furniture or appliance item can weigh up to 91kg (200lb); other items must weigh no more than 34kg (75lb) each. Carpet should be rolled in 4ft lengths.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS
Such as a water tank, boiler (which must all be drained).

CONSTRUCTION WASTE
Lumber or loose items must be bagged or tied securely in bundles no longer than 1.2 metres (4 ft). Nails should be bent over or removed.

SMALL AUTO PARTS
No fuel or fluids

NEW! As of April 1st, 2026, bulky waste will be collected on the same day as regular curbside collection on public roads. Residents on private roads should contact their cottage association for details.

RULES FOR BULKY WASTE COLLECTION

- A maximum of 2 bulky items will be collected per stop, with each item defined as a single object or securely tied bundle up to 4ft in length.
- Remove batteries from items; they can be dropped off at participating locations or our sites for free. This includes items with encased batteries.
- Do NOT leave items at the end of your driveway that you do not want collected, or mark them clearly with a sign that says Do Not Collect.
- Residents must remove any uncollected items from roadside after collection.

NOT ACCEPTED

Items not collected curbside!

COOLING DEVICES
Fridges, freezers, air conditioners, ice makers, water coolers, and dehumidifiers without a CFC sticker can be brought to our sites for a small fee to remove the CFCs.

ELECTRONICS*NEW*
Similar to televisions, you can bring kettles, computers, monitors, stereos, printers, telephones, hairdryers, countertop microwaves, air fryers, toasters, and more into our sites or participating EPRA locations for FREE. Visit <https://epra.ca/> for info.

Up to four rimless tires a day can be returned to any tire dealership, free of charge.

April 30 and October 30.

Bills must be paid within 30 days.

Interest on unpaid monies will be applied after thirty days (30) on the next business day following the due date.

WATER RATE CHANGES - EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026

Please note that as of July 1, 2026, the water rates will be changed and **will be reflected on the September 30th billing**. The new rates are as follows:

Metered Rates:

- ◆ 5/8" meter from \$97.95 to \$95.16
- ◆ 1 1/2" meter from \$459.81 to \$441.58
- ◆ 3/4" meter from \$143.8 to \$138.46
- ◆ 2" meter from \$731.20 to \$701.40
- ◆ 1" meter from \$233.65 to \$225.06
- ◆ 3" meter from \$1,454.92 to \$1,394.24

Consumption rates have increased from \$.90 per cubic meter (\$.00409 per gallon) to \$1.66 per cubic meter (\$.00755 per gallon). The minimum bill shall be the base charge. Users will continue to be charged the base fee whether their water is shut on or off.

Water On/Off charges: From \$20.00 to \$50.00

Sprinkler System: from \$320.00 to \$350.00 per annum

Subdivision Rates: 1 1/2" meter from \$459.81 to \$441.58 plus consumption rate

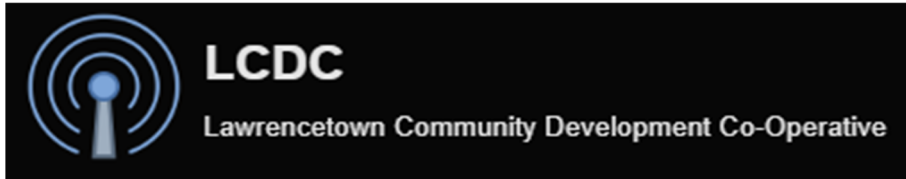


Water Bills

All properties are charged a flat fee water charge plus a usage fee. Vacant properties with water turned off are still charged the flat fee for service.

Bills are issued quarterly: March 30, June 30, September 30, and December 30.

Bills must be paid within 30 days. Interest on unpaid monies will be applied after thirty (30) days on the next business day following the due date.

A one-time 'refundable' membership fee of \$100 is required to join. The membership is refundable if you cancel the service, provided the account remains in good standing and the equipment is returned.

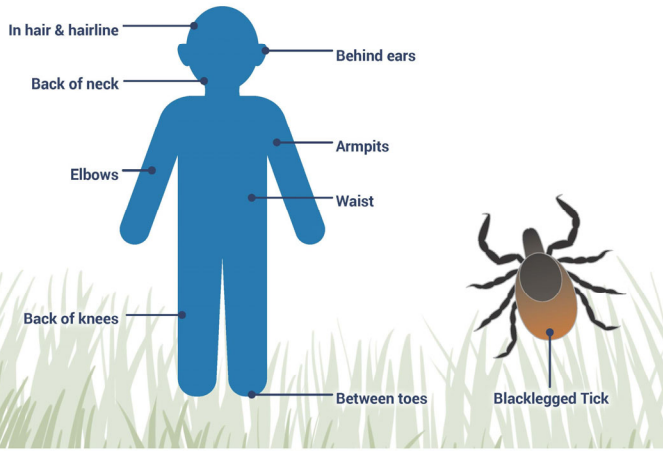

There are several kinds of ticks in the province but only the blacklegged tick can pass on bacteria that causes tick-borne illnesses like Lyme disease.

Always do a thorough tick-check after spending time outdoors.
